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Widespread Interest in First Hay and Grain Show

PENDLETON, Aug. 9.—The big hay and grain producing counties in Oregon and Washington have already reserved space for exhibits in the Northwest Grain and Hay show to be held in Pendleton from September 19 to 24, according to Fred Bennion, secretary. Exhibits from Idaho and Montana will also be entered under the direction of state commissioners, and all indications point to a show that will be truly representative of northwest production.

Four Washington counties and five Oregon counties have already reserved space for entries, in addition to space reserved for the Idaho and Montana exhibits. Douglas county, Washington, will feature Kahirko wheat and Rosen rye in their exhibit, and Whitman county, the largest wheat producing county in the United States, will have an exhibit of some of their best wheat. In addition to Walla Walla and Columbia counties, the Yakima valley counties will have hay exhibits at the show.

Wasco, Sherman, Morrow, Union and Wallawa counties in Oregon have

already reserved space for entries, while Umatilla growers will also have products on display at the show. Entries will also be made by growers from Baker, Malheur and Harney counties, according to Bennion, while several Willamette valley counties will compete for a share of the oat prize money.

One feature of the first annual Northwest Grain and Hay show will be a display arranged by the county agent of Umatilla county showing the effect of different methods of seed treatment. This display proved to be one of the stellar attractions of the 1920 Cereal Grain Show held in Pendleton and will be repeated this year. County Agent Bennion intends to sort out 200 kernels for each treatment. One box will be planted with seed treated with standard bluestone and it is expected that it will be full grown by the time of the show so that the stands may be noted. Other treatments to be tried include bluestone and salt, bluestone and lime, bluestone, salt and lime, formaldehyde, and copper carbonate. The box

ACTIVITY IN BAKER MINES

Number of Properties Being Further Developed—As Says Show Good Yields

BAKER, Aug. 9.—A rich silver strike in the Western Union mine on north fork of Rock creek, reported to be the biggest silver find ever made in that district is vouched for by A. A. Fiddler. The same mine during the past month produced some high grade gold ore.

According to a report received here a strike of silver in the Sea Foam district assays from 100 to 110 ounces per ton. This is the largest strike made in years. The property is owned by Carl Starcher of this city. He expects to start shipping ore soon.

Another strike has been made in the Bay Horse mine located in the Snake River Valley about eight miles north of Huntington. Some engineers examining the mine have predicted that it will equal the Coeur d'Alene district's Bunker Hill mine.

It has been determined that the mine contains an immense ore body and some assays have run as high as 450 ounces silver per ton. Three cars of ore have been shipped to the Tacoma Smelter, which average \$36.90 per ton, and several more carloads are now ready for shipment.

Although until now reticent about giving out information regarding the mine one of the officers has now given out a statement that the ore being mined is 20 feet in width and that another lens of the same width and importance has been located.

This property is owned by the U. S. Metals company, of Spokane, Washington. This company is said to be closely allied with the Sumpter Valley Smelter company, which is putting the smelter at Sumpter in shape to operate again.

The company expects to install a compressor and other machinery in the Bay Horse mine. The machinery will be electrically driven, a power line crossing its property. As the rail road also crosses the property the company is well equipped for shipping. It is also contemplated to drive a lower tunnel, opening the mine to a considerable depth.

This property is patented and owned by Pendleton people. It has been idle for a number of years and the decision to re-open this year is due largely to the renewed activity in other sections of the district. Ore carrying veins of gold and silver have been opened by about 800 feet of shafting and tunnels. It is planned to drive a long cross cut tunnel from the existing creek, near the headwaters of which the property is located.

BONUS NOT NEAR READY FOR BOYS

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 9.—There will be no bonus money available before November or December at the earliest, according to an estimate today by H. C. Brumbaugh, executive secretary of commission in charge of the administration of the Oregon bonus law.

Preliminary organization work, preparation of necessary forms, approval of the bonus bonds as to form and legality and the sale of the bonds themselves will make it impossible to begin the payment of any actual cash to Oregon's ex-service men either as a cash bonus or as a loan before that time, Brumbaugh explains.

September Filing Date. Everything will be in readiness for the filing of applications from Oregon ex-service men about September 1, Brumbaugh states. These applications are to be made on blanks which can be procured either directly from the bonus commission's office in Salem or through the American Legion posts, all of which will be provided with an ample supply of these initial application blanks.

These blanks will serve to establish the eligibility of the applicant to participate in the bonus features, showing his service record and his residence. On it also the applicant will indicate whether he desires to receive the cash bonus or the loan. In either event a second blank will then be forwarded to the applicant on which to complete his application. In the event the ex-service man elects to take advantage of the loan feature of the bill he must also indicate on the initial application blank whether the loan is to be made on city or farm property.

Option Afforded. The bonus law provides for the payment of a cash bonus to Oregon ex-service men at the rate of \$15 for every month served in the army, navy or marine corps of the United States during the World War. In lieu of the cash bonus the ex-service man may elect to take the loan of not to exceed \$2000 which must be secured by real property 25 per cent greater in value than the amount of the loan.

Copper carbonate is a new treatment, which is being used extensively in Australia and has met with favorable results in California. It is declared to be a dry treatment which does not incur the grief of other solutions. With white club wheat especially susceptible to smut, a disease which has caused a loss to Umatilla county alone nearly a quarter million dollars each year, according to reliable estimates, it is expected that this new treatment will prove an interesting exhibit at the show.

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
