WHEAT SHOWS A CENT UP

PORTLAND, Aug. 11.—Wheat of this market sold at \$1.05 to \$1.13 today.

CHICAGO, Aug. 11.—Heavy profit-taking sales more than wiped out in the wheat market yesterday advances due to the government crop report.

Although the wheat market opened with general buying and a material upturn in prices, the fact soon became evident that speculation had fully dissipated beforehand whatever was built in the official crop estimates from Washington. Much of the selling on the advance came from a big elevator concern.
