PARIS, Aug. 12.—France and Great Britain have decided to refer the Upper Silesia question to the League of Nations. The question involves drawing the boundary line between Poland and Germany and it threatened yesterday to bring a break in the Allied council meeting.

Flowers Found New Homes.
