### PENDLETON HAS SHOOTING AFFAIR

PENDLETON, Aug. 12.—Charles A. Weatherford is in the hospital with a bullet in his back as a result of a shooting fray Thursday night in which he is said to have attempted to shoot his former wife, Mrs. Osla Weatherford, and then turned the gun on himself.

Mrs. Weatherford was not injured beyond the burns inflicted on her neck by powder, and the condition of Weatherford is not at all serious, it is thought.

On Crying "Jag." The shooting was staged shortly after 7 o'clock last night at the woman's home, 126 Thompson street.

Weatherford came here from his home in Washington, and Henry Keys, owner of the house where Mrs. Weatherford and her four children are living declared this morning that Weatherford has attempted to get Mrs. Weatherford to forget their past difficulties. She was granted a divorce about a month ago.

After a day which he is said to have spent participating freely of moonshine, Weatherford returned home last night, Mr. Keys said, and he had arrived at the crying stage of a drunken spree.

"Put That Gun Down." Weatherford was crying about the time of the shooting, Keys said this morning, "and the children were crying, too, and I didn't pay much attention to what was going on. I was in my own room. Then I heard Mrs. Weatherford say: 'Charley, put that gun down!' then the sound of the report reached me.

"I guess she would have been killed if she had had less nerve. She rushed toward him, instead of running away and the man missed. Her neck was burned by the powder.

"He turned the gun on himself then and fired one shot. The bullet struck over his heart, but he wasn't hurt bad. He tried to get the revolver after we got it away from him."

At St. Anthony's hospital today where Weatherford was taken after the shooting, it was stated that he was resting very well.

"He is not seriously injured," was the statement made by the hospital authorities.

The bullet is thought to have followed the rib around his side and lodged in his back just beneath the skin.
