HAWAIIANS THE FIRST FLIERS

Natives Enjoyed Thrills of Aviation Centuries Ago, Is Claim

HONOLULU, T. H., Aug. 22.—Thrills of flying were enjoyed by Hawaiians centuries before aviation was invented, according to stories told by natives of today. Their ancestors got their aerial excitement by jumping off cliffs into the ocean in home-made "planes."

They made a regular game of it, known as "lele pail" or "jumping from the cliff." It was played up to a hundred years or so ago by natives who lived near groves of fan palms near high cliffs overlooking the ocean.

Details of the game have been obtained by William J. Coelbe, a former newspaper editor now an officer of the Hale o na Ali Hawaii (House of Chiefs). This is what he says of the vanished sport:

The game was played with huge contrivances built of light but stout sticks and overwoven with lulu palm leaves. Several of these affairs were made ready, the Hawaiians "aviators" took their seats, and were pushed over towering cliffs at the same time. The aviator who remained longest in the air was the winner.

Often through carelessness or excitement a "plane" would execute a nose dive similar to those of twentieth century airplanes. The only damage was the loss of the game.

Old Hawaiians say that their flying men were exceptionally skillful. The only means they had of guiding their crude appliances was to shift their weight to maintain balance as they zigzagged down toward the sea.

A fleet of outrigger canoes anchored off shore to pick up the sportsmen and retrieve the "planes." Exceptionally daring Hawaiians often hopped off thousand foot cliffs on the mainland, it is said.

DRIVE ON FOR SCHOOL FUNDS

American School in China Raising Its Final Funds

SHANGHAI, Aug. 22.—Plans were taking form through the summer in Shanghai to open a campaign in the fall to raise a final Taels 150,000 to begin work on the erection of the first buildings of a new American school. These first structures consisting of a class room building and a dormitory and the ground will cost approximately Taels 457,000, or about \$330,000 in gold. Of the Taels 457,000 required, the 224,000 have been raised. The 107,000 having been given in a campaign for funds held in Shanghai last year and 115,000 having been contributed by Mission Boards in the United States.

It has been planned to make the new school a center of American community life in Shanghai. The site that has been selected is a tract of about 17 acres located admirably in the French Concession.

The American school in Shanghai originally was founded by the various American missions in 1912, being housed in a number of dwellings in the northern part of the city. In the school year that closed 219 pupils were cared for and the facilities of the institution were taxed to the utmost to provide for all applicants. The school now provides eight years of school work and four years of high school. A class of ten was graduated this year.

While under control of missions in Shanghai the school has always been open to Americans generally. A change to be made in connection with the new project is that the new institution will be governed by a board of managers of whom half will be appointed by the different missions and half by representatives of the business community.

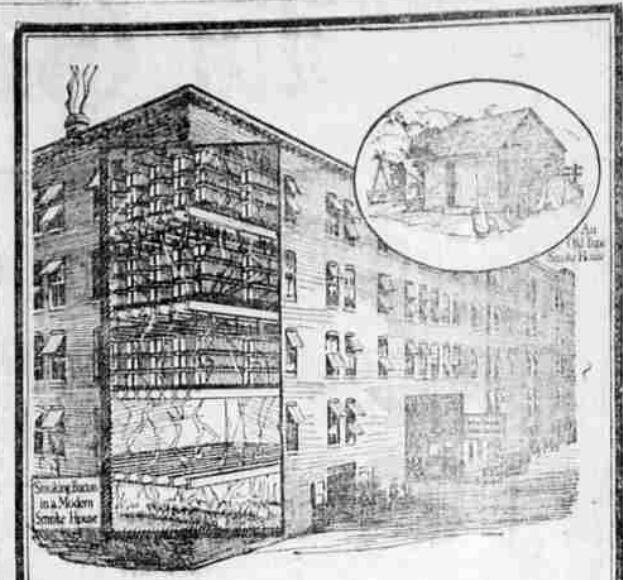
