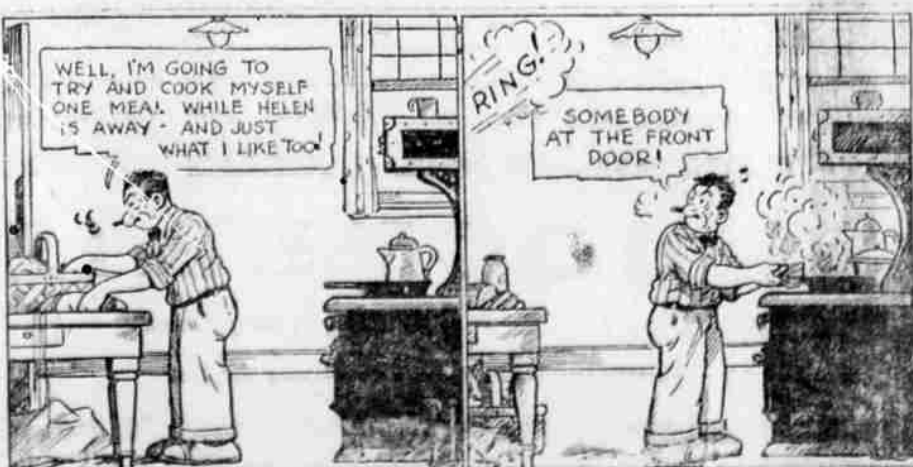
EXPORT DEMAND GOOD

"Buying wheat on the statistical situation has been unprofitable, as prices have declined in the face of a big export demand. The main point is the lack of outside speculative buying to offset the big volume of hedges being carried in all markets, and close observers say that until there is a decided increase in the outside demand permanency to the bulges is not to be expected."
