BERLIN BROODS OVER MURDER

Erzberger's Death Basis for Strong Political Feud now Forming.

BERLIN, Aug. 30.—No single event in post-revolutionary Germany has unleashed partisan fury with such vehemence as the assassination of Matthias Erzberger, which is discussed in Berlin in degrees of passion that apparently know no restraint.

The Freiheit insists that primary responsibility for the murder rests upon Herr Erzberger's leading political opponents. "The revolutionaries," the newspaper declares, "were loaded in the editorial rooms of the Kreuzzeitung, the Deutsche Tageszeitung and other pan-American organs."

Vorwarts is outspoken in condemnation of the National and German peoples par iea, their leaders and their newspaper organs, whom it charges with moral responsibility for the murder because of their "unrelenting persecution" of the former minister who, it declares, "when the collapse came, had the courage to stand by the fatherland and negotiate the armistice for which Hindenburg and Ludendorff begged on their knees after William fled to Holland."

Blames Right Parties. The clerical organ Germania which was close to Herr Erzberger through out his political career, says the deed was the melancholy consequence of the campaign of vilification and heckling carried on by the parties of the right, which it declares did not hesitate to use the most contemptible falsehoods in their pursuit of the dead man.

The Tagblatt says: "Responsibility for the murder attaches to Nationalist' coat tails. Its effect on the radical masses is bound to assert itself."

"The shots that killed Erzberger threaten to become a danger signal," says the Vossische Zeitung, which expresses the fear that the work of internal reconstruction which was progressing hopefully now has been placed in jeopardy.

The Socialist and communist newspapers call upon the masses to join a common rally for the fight against reactionaries along the whole front. The Nationalistic organs, visibly distressed over the murder, make editorial efforts to denounce the deed, at the same time cautioning against undue haste in arriving at any conclusions while the murder has not yet been cleared up.

Socialists to Demonstrate. Socialists and laborites are arranging for demonstrations throughout Germany against the "White Terror" for Wednesday, the date set for the funeral of Matthias Erzberger, assassinated Friday. It is said members of the Leftist party intend to permit no militarist demonstration without counter movements.

Two students arrested on suspicion of being connected with the assassination have been released.

President Ebert Monday will propose over a cabinet council which will consider the internal situation. Chancellor Wirth, in a speech before the Catholic conference at Frankfurt Sunday, referred to the "passionate strife" with which the country is being shaken.

"I must return to Berlin immediately," he added, "because I must keep my eyes open there to guard against disaster befalling the country as the result of the recent occurrences which fill us with horror."

THINKS WILL BE A STRIKE. SCRANTON, Pa., Aug. 30.—Roundhouse and shop employees of the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western railroad were advised to save their money and lay in stores of food by T. J. Maloney, general chairman of the Lackawanna System federation, at a mass meeting Sunday. He declared a strike was sure to come and he wanted the men prepared.

Pioneer of Umtilla County Passes Away

PENDLETON, Aug. 30.—Owen McLaughlin, aged 84, a resident of Umtilla county for the past 38 years, died on Saturday in Portland at the Good Samaritan hospital, from a complication of diseases due to his advanced age.

Mr. McLaughlin was born in Donegal, Ireland, in 1837, and came to the United States in 1856. He raised stock in the region of Duncan until 12 years ago, when he came to Pendleton to reside with his daughter, Mrs. Annie McLeod.

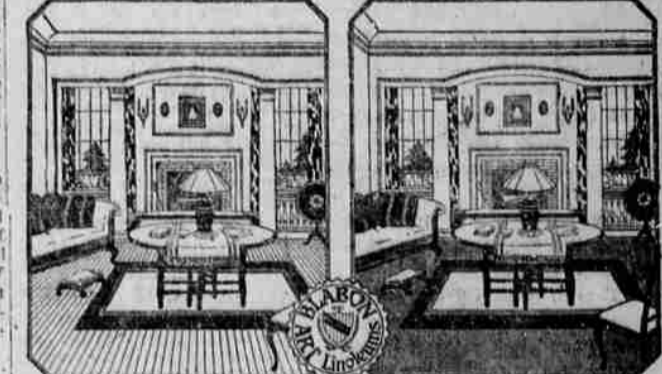

DELEGATIONS TO BE LARGE ONES

Every Nation Seems to be Going to Send a Hundred or More.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 30.—Washington officials have begun to get an idea of the magnitude of the armistice and far eastern conferences in point of the number of participants. The British government, responding to informal inquiries, advised the state department that its delegation and accompanying staff would number about 100 persons. The Chinese government several days ago informed officials here that its representatives and their attendants probably would total almost a hundred.

Special Ship for Japanese. It is understood here that a special steamship and two special railroad trains will be used for the transportation of this Japanese delegation, which at this time promises to be the most numerous of any taking part in the conference.

One result of the signature of the German-American peace treaty having been to confirm the American rights to equal participation with the other allied and associated powers in the disposition of the formerly German owned colonies and islands of the Pacific, it has now become possible to conduct negotiations directly between the United States and Japan for the settlement of the disputed claims for cede control of the island of Yap and other issues that it is desired to eliminate from the discussion of the coming conference.

GIRL IS HURT IN ACCIDENT

Car Overturns Near Pendleton and Injures Sixteen-year-old Girl Saturday.

PENDLETON, Aug. 30.—Marie Fletcher, 16, was seriously injured early Saturday when the car in which she was riding, driven by her father, R. W. Fletcher, overturned at an embankment two miles east of Barnhart, pinning her beneath the front seat for an hour before the car could be lifted. Wesley Fletcher, Doris Bennett and Lottie Bennett, other occupants of the car, with Miss Fletcher and her father, were uninjured. Miss Fletcher is now at St. Anthony's hospital with a crushed shoulder and serious bruises, but it is said that she will recover in a short time. The party was returning from a dance at Stanfield about 3 a. m. when the accident occurred. The car was almost a complete wreck. The cause of the accident is held to be a faulty steering gear.
