WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—Italy has formally accepted President Harding's invitation to participate in the Disarmament and Far East conference. The acceptance of Italy has completed the list. Great Britain, France, China and Japan having already formally accepted.

ARMED FORCES NECESSARY.
WASHINGTON, Sept. 1.—President Harding speaking at the opening of the fall term of the Army War College today declared that no matter "where the best aspirations of the world lead us there never may be a time without necessity for armed forces."
