

NEW Y. M. C. A. SCHEDULE OUT

Many Classes in Physical Training to Meet Each Week this Winter, According to Announcement

The classes in physical training at the Y. M. C. A., will be resumed for the winter months next week. A new schedule has been prepared, which becomes effective immediately. All the classes organized last year will again be held and several new classes are planned.

The prep school boys, boys of ten to twelve years of age, will meet Saturday mornings at 10:45. The younger boys' class meets Mondays and Thursdays at 4:15 and the older boys, lads from 14 to 16 years old, meet Tuesdays and Fridays at 4:15. The intermediate class composed of boys from 15 to 18 years old will meet Mondays and Thursdays at 7:15 and the young men's class, composed of young men over 18 years of age, meet Mondays and Thursdays at 8:15.

The business men's class is scheduled for Tuesdays and Fridays at 5:15. All business men are busy men but in order to accommodate those who are so busy that they cannot get away from their business in time to attend the regular class of business men a special class called the busy men's class will be organized to meet Tuesdays and Fridays at 6:15.

The grade school girls will meet Saturday at 9:30 and the high school girls will meet Mondays and Thursdays at 5:30 while the women's class, the minimum age for entrance being 18, will meet Tuesdays and Friday evenings at 7:15.

All basket ball practice will be held Wednesday. The younger boys will play at 4:15, the older boys at 5:15, the intermediates at 7:15 and the young men at 8:15.

Physical examinations will be by appointment only. The boy scouts will meet every Friday evening at 7:40. Both troops will meet at this time, instead of having separate meeting hours as heretofore. The wireless club meets every Saturday afternoon at one at the Y. M. C. A. unless some other meeting place is announced for some special purpose.

No meeting dates have been yet decided on for the orchestra and the rifle corps, the two other organizations being fostered by the Y. M. C. A.
