WALLOWA, Sept. 23.—(Special)—The Public Service Commission was in Enterprise Wednesday and Thursday of this week conducting a hearing, arranging the changing of the rates of the Enterprise Electric Co. This will have effect upon the towns of Wallowa, Joseph, Enterprise and Lostine.
