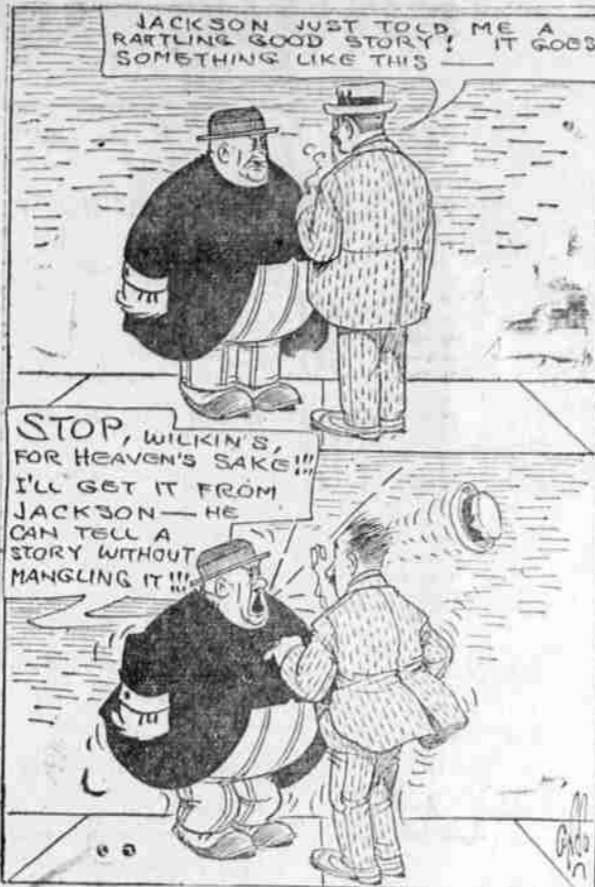

TO HONOLULU**

Two Football Games to be Played in Islands During Christmas Vacation This Year.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Sept. 24—(Special)—A trip to Hawaii, with its famous beaches and scenic attractions, is the prize held out to candidates for the University of Oregon football team this year. Seventeen successful players will be taken to Honolulu over the Christmas holidays to play the University of Hawaii on Christmas day and an all-star island team on January 2. All expenses for the trip will be paid by the Hawaiians.

Steamship reservations have been made for the ocean voyage and practically everything has been decided about the trip except the personnel of the team which will make it. Forty husky players are battling every night for places on the first team and with a wealth of good material and with prospects of going on the best trip ever offered an Oregon athletic team "Coach" Shy Huntington should turn out an excellent football organization.

Five regular games have been scheduled for the Oregon varsity this season and the schedule is as follows: Oct. 1, Willamette at Salem; Oct. 8, Pacific University at Eugene; Oct. 15, Idaho at Portland; Oct. 22, California at Berkeley; Nov. 5, Washington State at Pullman; Nov. 19, O. A. C. at Eugene; Nov. 24, Multnomah Club at Portland; Dec. 26, University of Hawaii at Honolulu; Jan. 2, All Hawaiian Team at Honolulu.

**CONFERENCE TO
BE IN DETROIT**

DETROIT, Mich., Sept. 26—Important changes in the government of the Unitarian church are to be discussed here at the Twenty-sixth biennial conference of the church, October 4-7, inclusive, according to announcement of church leaders. The meeting, to be attended by about 700 delegates from the United States and Canada is described in the official call for the conference as "one of the cross-roads in American Unitarianism."

Chief Justice William Howard Taft of the United States Supreme court, president of the conference, will deliver one of the chief addresses.

"The Defects and Remedies of the Congregational Policy," and "The Obligations of the Church in Schools and Colleges" will be two of the chief subjects discussed during the conference. Plans for continuation of the Unitarian religious and educational campaign also will receive attention.

Among the leading speakers on the conference program in addition to Justice Taft are William Wallace Penn, D. D., dean of Harvard Divinity school, Dr. William L. Sullivan of New York City, Rev. John B. Lathrop of Brooklyn, and Rev. Sydney H. Snow of Montreal.

The delegates will spend one day of the session at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor, Michigan, is one of the Universities chosen by the church as a center for increased activity.

"Mrs. Amy Burt from Bend, Oregon, recently rescued a thousand children, bringing them to a place of safety on two trains which she herself secured and one of which she conducted."

"When I saw just one of the 47 girls for whom Frances Gage of Portland risked and gave her life I felt that she had not died in vain."
"Margaret Minnan, of Forest Grove, had a most thrilling escape from the Turks who compelled her and a large party of relief workers to leave Marsovan. She is now in Constantinople waiting for conditions to stabilize so that she can return to her chosen field in the interior."

"Miss Ethel Long Newman, O. A. C. '20, who went with our party was already installed as office manager at Alexandropolis where we have 12,000 children. Her husband has been appointed to the agricultural work in that district."

"Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Rambo, of Baker, Oregon, helped care for more than 200 children at Harounieh until the advancing battle lines drove them out. They made a most thrilling and dramatic rescue of the children, staying with them until they sailed for the Isle of Cyprus then they went to Constantinople. From there to Batoum where they rescued thousands of Greeks who were unroofed helplessly at that place. On account of the work of Mr. and Mrs. Rambo and others the Queen of Greece has written a most hearty letter of appreciation and sent a liberal check for the work of the Near East Relief."

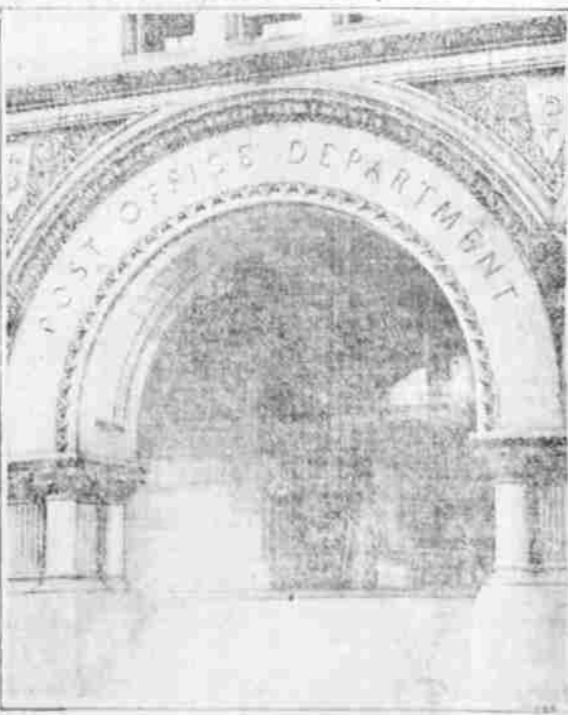
