Gooding College Sunday to be on October Second

GOODING, Idaho, Sept. 28.—According to the report of President C. W. Tenney October 2 will be observed as Gooding College Sunday by the Methodist churches of Southern Idaho and Eastern Oregon.

This was decided by a unanimous vote at the session of the annual conference which met at Twin Falls recently and posters are already hard at work on their educational program for that day.

Though organized only three years ago last November, Gooding College has grown until it is now filling an important place in the educational work of the Inter-Mountain Empire. Last year it had a regular enrollment of 137 with as many more for the short course and the pastor's rural life school. The present enrollment is thirty-five per cent larger than it was a year ago at this time, the department of business having the credit for much of the increase.
