Roses in Abundance. When roses are to be grown out of doors make cuttings about six inches long from mature wood in the fall before severe freezing weather, tie in bundles and store in moist sand over winter. They are planted in V-shaped trenches in the spring, with only one bud showing. When grown under glass, cuttings are made in November and December and planted in sand in cold frames or cool greenhouses, potted in February or March and planted out in the open ground when warm weather arrives.
