AMERICAN DIES IN BRITAIN.

LONDON, Oct. 5.—Grenville A. Ellis, a prominent figure in the American colony in England, publisher of books of reference and connoisseur and art collector, died recently in the Isle of Wight.

Mr. Ellis, who was from Boston and married "Max Elliott," an American writer, for many years contributor, chiefly on theatrical subjects, to Boston papers, came to London 40 years ago and had been a resident here ever since. He published some of the standard reference books and devoted his spare time to the collection of old prints on which subject he was considered one of the greatest experts.

Many of his purchases found their way into American art museums.
