AT SHERRY'S

Neal Hart, starring in "Danger Valley," is fast becoming known for his insistence that his picture shall be "the real thing."

He made the greater part of this latest Hart picture on the desert in Death Valley, Calif., and managed to get himself into a portion of that arid waste of sand that had never before been reached by human foot. The picture itself stands as proof of that fact, containing some of the most remarkable "desert stuff" ever "shot" for the motion pictures.

Upon Hart's return from the desert, the Los Angeles Times gave him a big writeup and described the hardships endured by Hart's party. The trip was made "to get the real thing in motion pictures."

When this story was published, it was revealed that Hart had scorched himself while making "Hell's Oasis," a previous release, had frozen himself during the filming of "Skyfire," a story of the Canadian Northwest, and had known the terrible threat of the desert country to get "the real thing" for "Danger Valley."
