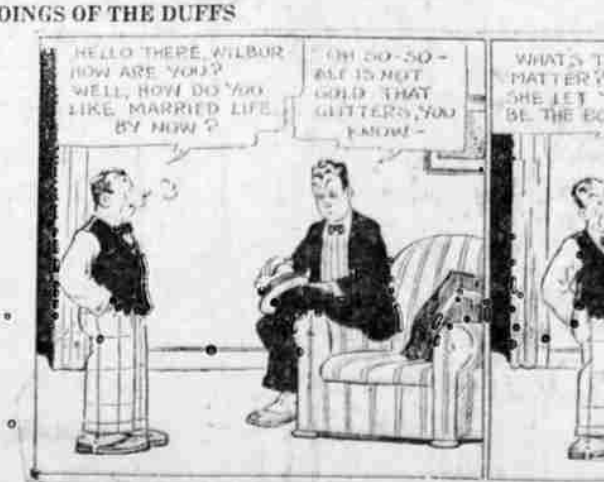

J. Warren Kerrigan comes to the Sherry theatre tomorrow only in "The Joyous Liar," his newest Robert Brantton picture released by Hollywood.

A particularly clever story, combining the elements of comedy, adventure, love interest and situation thrills, was written especially for Mr. Kerrigan. 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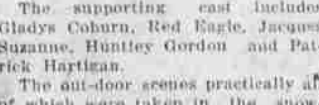
