GENUINE CIVIL WAR UNIFORMS IN PLAY

Many of the scenes for "The Heart of Maryland," Vitaphone's big special production of the famous play by David Belasco, which will be shown at the Sherry Theatre last times today were taken in the South. Tom Terriss, under whose supervision and direction the picture was made, believed that only in the scenes of the actual fighting in the Civil War could the proper scenery and atmosphere be obtained, and to this end he took the company into Maryland.

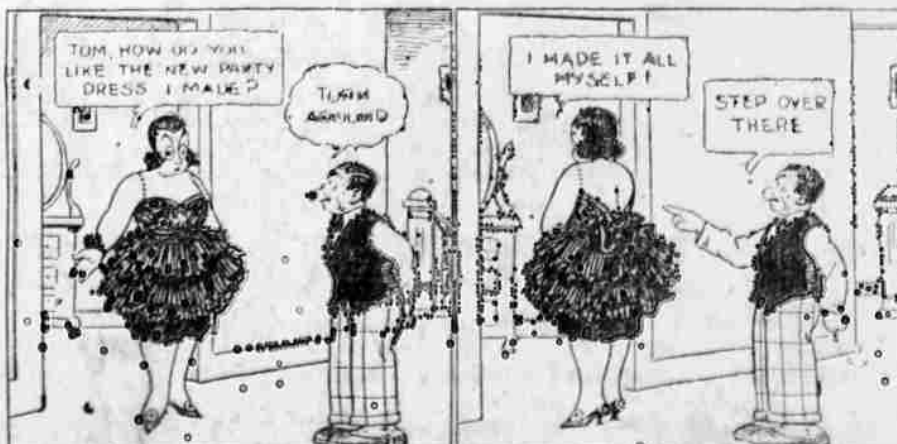

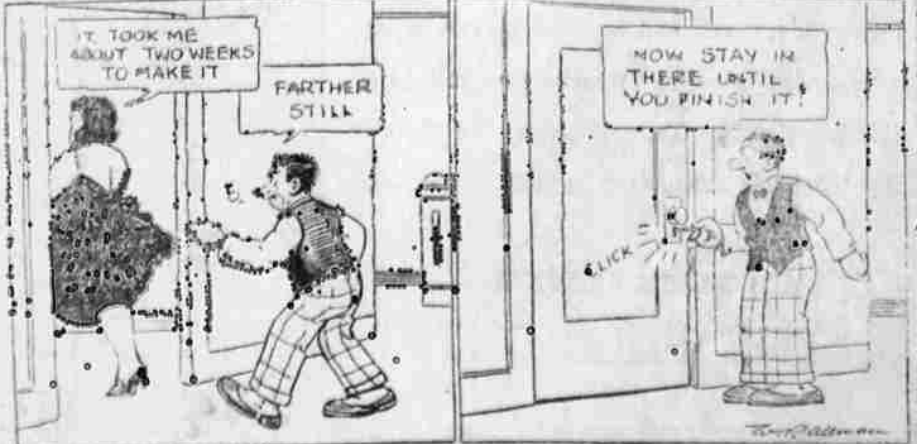
