Notice is hereby given to whom it may concern, that the Commission of the city of La Grande, Union County Oregon proposes and intends to improve Improvement District No. 119 in the city of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, by grading Second street from the north line of O avenue to the north line of the alley in Blocks 76 and 77 of Chaplin's Addition to the Town of La Grande, Oregon and N avenue from the east line of Second street to the east line of First street and by grading the same for a width of thirty feet in the center of said streets and by constructing the necessary catch basins according to the plans and specifications made by the city engineer therefor and adopted and filed September 21st, 1921, and to make such improvement at the expense of the property in said District to be benefited thereby.
