THEY LIKE JAZZ. MEXICO CITY, Oct. 19.—American "jazz devils" have come to Mexico City and have made their syncopation popular but theatre-going Mexicans have failed to appreciate an American musical comedy as recently presented by a company of "girly-girls" direct from Broadway, to use the words of the inspired press agent. The company appeared here as one of the attractions of the Centennial celebration.
