## MANY ENTRIES IN STOCK SHOW

Over Three Thousand Head of Pure Bred Stock Already Entered at Portland.

PORTLAND, Oct. 25.—Entries for 3912 head of pure bred stock have been made for the Pacific International Livestock Exposition, November 5-12, according to announcement by G. M. Plummer, general manager of the exposition which will fill a ten acre pavilion at North Portland.

The animals will come from many western states, with several entries from eastern and middle western states. Each will be a champion in its own district, sent to the final livestock show of the west to compete for honors and the \$75,000 cash premiums that are to be awarded.

Last year entries numbered something over 2700. A new section of the show, aside from the purchased livestock will be the Western Winter Poultry show, for which 2509 pens have been prepared.

Entries of the various breeds for the livestock show follow:  
Dairy cattle—Holsteins, 300; Jer-

seys, 240; Guernseys, 150; Ayrshires 100; total 830.  
Beef Cattle—Herefords, 120; Shorthorns, 200; Aberdeen Angus, 75; Red Polled, 15; total 410.  
Swine, 650; sheep and goats, 797; draft horses, 150; show horses, 175; total, 3912.
