Drunks Lead in Arrest Causes During October

Reports for the month of October were presented to the city commission last night by several city officials. The report of Roy Flexer, chief of police, showed that there were 32 arrests made during the month and a total of \$227.50 in fines and forfeits collected. Of the causes for arrests, drunkenness led all others with 15 charges of that nature. Traffic violations came a close second to the front of the strong, hickory moonshine, there being 12 arrests due to violations of traffic laws. Five were arrested on gambling charges and the balance were distributed among a number of other causes.

The report of Mrs. E. M. Foster, city treasurer, showed that if the collection of receipts and expenditures of last month could be maintained in definitely, the city would grow wealthy. On the first of last month the balance on hand was \$12,366.94. During the month, \$8,878.12 was received and \$4,041.11 paid out, leaving a balance on the first of this month of \$16,547.85.

Rural Route Vacancy Examination Soon

On December 10 an examination is to be held at the La Grande post office by the U. S. civil service commission for the purpose of filling the position of rural carrier at Alsea and vacancies that may occur later from other post offices in Union county.

The salary of a rural carrier on a standard daily wagon route of 24 miles is \$1,800 per annum, with an additional \$50 per mile per annum for each mile or major fraction thereof in excess of 24 miles. The salary on motor routes ranges from \$2,450 to \$2,600 per annum, according to length. The examination will be open only to citizens who are actually domiciled in the territory of a post office in the county. Both men and women, if qualified, may enter this examination, but appointing officers have the legal right to specify the sex desired in requesting certification of eligibles.

"Pete" Beebe, young farm hand who was employed by John Painter and son, whose bodies were found in a shallow grave on their farm on Tuesday, was bound over to the grand jury today on a charge of first degree murder by Justice of the Peace Victor J. Oliver. An attorney was appointed to defend him.
