

MAKES PLEA FOR ETERNAL PEACE

CLEVELAND, Nov. 8. — There must be created during this generation a fellowship among the peoples of the earth which will make forever impossible the devastating sweep of world war, Miss Clara Ormond Williams, president of the National Education Association, told the National Conference of the Junior Red Cross in session here this afternoon.

"Such a fellowship must begin with the children," Miss Williams said. "It must rest upon a foundation of universal intelligence. It must be rooted in a common fund of knowledge, in ideas universally respected because they are right. There must be built into the emotional fabric of the children of this generation a feeling of world brotherhood—a feeling so compelling that they will be willing to think and work and sacrifice for world peace as much as in the past men have sacrificed for narrow purposes and mistaken wars. If this generation of children is to be given this background of education, the work will have to be done largely through the schools. There must be educational opportunities equalized by State and National aid until every child can be given a competent well-trained teacher in hearty accord with American ideals. The Nation is abundantly able to afford such a program."

"National wealth has increased from sixty-five billion in 1899 to 275 billion in 1918—an increase of over 576 per cent. This increase in wealth is primarily the result of education, but a just proportion of it has not been put back into investment in education. Our people should be as willing to finance education as they

are to finance armies and navies. The cost of the battleship Tennessee, which is \$35,000,000, would finance an adequate State program in education for the State of Tennessee for a period of four years. Any reasonable limitation of armament would save enough money to finance universal brotherhood and world peace."

"If this ideal of world brotherhood is ever to be realized, its acceptance will come in consequence of the influences that surround the childhood of the Nation, whose lives are now being fixed, whose ideas and emotions are in the making."

Reclamation Engineer Will Soon Visit the Powder River Project

BAKER, Nov. 8. — C. C. Fisher, engineer of the reclamation service who is in charge of the survey of the Powder River irrigation project yesterday received word that James Munn, consulting engineer of the service, will be a visitor in this city on November 16 to 18. Mr. Munn, who was in charge of constructing work on the Arrow Rock dam near Boise, will visit the project for the purpose of becoming acquainted with it. According to Mr. Fisher a survey of the north side of the project has developed the fact that by constructing the main canal on this side it will be materially shortened and will do away with a large amount of work through rock cliffs. Eight men are at present engaged in the survey of the canal site and four men on the survey of the reservoir site.

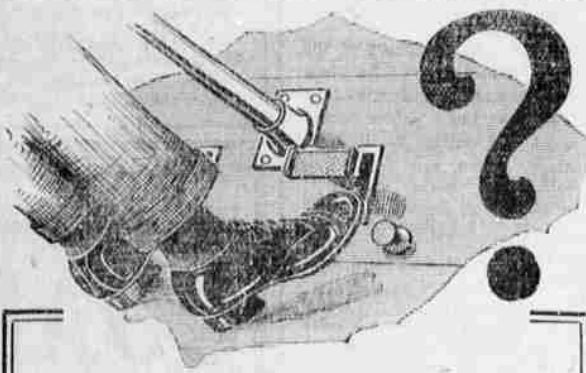
