### BIG STRUGGLE IN FOOTBALL

Annual struggle. Dating back to 1875 the annual gridiron battle between the two famous universities is so surrounded and entwined with rivalry and football tradition that, with the possible exception of the Harvard-Yale contest, it exceeds in interest from an eastern standpoint any other game of the year. Year in and year out regardless of whether the two teams are of exceptional power or merely mediocre in comparison with other college teams of the same section, the battle of the Bulldog and the Tiger fanned in song and story, attracts record attendance. Each fall the Palmer Memorial Stadium, at Princeton, or the Yale Bow here, as the case may be, is taxed to capacity and thousands of applications for tickets are returned for lack of seats. Tomorrow's game is no exception to the huge football amphitheater of the Blue has been sold out for weeks and tickets would command many a hundred percent premium were they available to the speculators.

Interest among the undergraduates, alumni and general followers of the football chances of the two elevens is particularly keen this year for some unusual circumstances surround the coming contest and there is a possibility that traditions of the game may be shattered. After several seasons of rather indifferent playing form and power, Yale appears to have developed a combination more in keeping with the football history of the Blue. Under the coaching of Tad Jones, a former Eli star of magnitude, Yale appears to

possess a fast, rangy, alert eleven, each player possessing that keen football instinct which is a gift and seldom acquired by the dull, practice routine. Team after team has gone down before the attack of the Elfs without scoring and even the strong army eleven was defeated 14 to 7. Against this rejuvenated Bulldog, the New Jersey University will hurl what several months ago was expected to be the best team of the season in the east. Injuries and the loss of several players due to ineligibility, scholastic or otherwise, has sapped some of its gridiron strength and notwithstanding the splendid showing of the Tigers a week ago in the game with Harvard, the eleven is not the invincible combination which the supporters of the Orange and Black hoped for at the beginning of the season.

Defeats by both the Navy and the University of Chicago in midseason checked Princeton progress. These setbacks while sobering the conquering prospects of the Tigers have increased their desire to complete the season with a victory over their traditional rival. The entire squad from varsity star to third string substitute will consider the Princeton football season of 1921 a complete success if Yale can be defeated on its home gridiron.
