AUTO CLUBS SEEK MEMBERS

DETROIT, MICH., Nov. 21—Initial move in an effort to increase membership of automobile clubs in larger cities of the country, to promote new clubs in intermediate and small cities and to bring closer cooperation between motor clubs generally, will be made at a meeting here November 21 and 22 of the executive board of the American Automobile Association and presidents, secretaries and managers of state and city automobile clubs from all parts of the United States.

The conference has been called by George C. Diehl of Buffalo, president of the national association. In his call for the meeting Mr. Diehl declared that under the plan to be proposed automobile clubs in larger cities of the country will be expected to organize municipalities in their districts.

When the smaller clubs have been placed on a business basis their operation will be put in the hands of local motorists, the interest of the larger organizations being only to develop them to a point insuring their success. The plan also includes a provision for establishment of mechanical aid service for members of clubs. Such a system is employed in England.

The A. A. A. touring board also will provide accurate and up-to-date maps for use by members of clubs. An effort will be made to have each club in every state provide its members.
