Credits Needed.

BERLIN, Nov. 21.—A communication handed the reparations commission by Chancellor Wirth, telling of the German government's willingness to seek foreign credits required to meet the January reparations payment, has been received by the public as confirming the belief that the government possesses no illusions as regards its ability to avenge a period of arduous. The commission left Saturday for Paris.

The belief has prevailed in Berlin official circles since the arrival 10 days ago of the reparations commission that it was the prime object of the commission to obtain at first hand an idea on which to base its attitude for an adjustment of Germany's reparations payments.

Informal Talk.

Deliberations of the commission were informal, although heads of the foreign office are reported to have made strong efforts to impress the members with the effect of a forced entry by Germany into the foreign money markets. It is asserted that the commissioners have declined to suggest other measures of relief.

The Reichsbank statement for the week of November 15, announced the addition of two billion five hundred million marks in new paper to the national currency, bringing the total to more than one hundred two billion marks.

Nationalist newspapers are upbraiding the chancellor for "the miserable collapse of his policy and its fulfillment at the expense of the taxpayers," as the Tageszeitung puts it.

depth of 27 inches on the level. There was still nearly two feet on the ground at an early hour this afternoon.

Traffic was practically at a standstill in La Grande all day yesterday. A number of automobilists attempted to take their cars out but no progress was made by most of them. Trucks were able to plow through the snow in many cases and sleighs were brought out of their seclusion today by many in need of some quick means of transportation. Today automobiles are able to use the main traveled streets although on many streets no trail has yet been broken.

Warehouse Caved In.

A warehouse in the rear of the Hooverized grocery in which salt and other stock was stored collapsed yesterday when the roof was being cleaned off. A number of weak wooden roof's were also reported to have given way.

From all parts of the county reports come to the effect that the snow fall during the week end was extremely heavy. Wallowa county is also covered with snow. Trains on the Wallowa county branch line have been able to maintain schedule time during the storm.

Much Benefit.

The heavy snow will greatly benefit the farmers of the county because of the moisture during the past month's having been scarce. The winter wheat is expected to take on considerably more growth as the result of the storm before winter actually sets in and spring wheat and summer fallow land will have much additional moisture stored this winter that will result in a greatly increased crop next year.

Movie Films Delayed.

One of the disagreeable parts of the storm for many people was the delay in the film for "Over the Hill" reaching this city. The picture should have begun a run at the Star last night but the film has not arrived as yet and the first showing of the picture will be announced later in the week.

Reports from Washington and western Oregon indicate that the storm has done considerable damage in places by causing breaking of telephone lines and snow and cold weather has invaded some of the coast cities that made themselves on their snow-free climate when tourists flock to the coast in the summer.

At Tacoma and Centralia, Washington, ice did considerable damage. At Seattle snow fell and with the low temperature prevailing resulted in many traffic accidents, 40 being reported Saturday night. Spokane had a temperature of 2 degrees above zero Saturday night and the telephone wires between Portland and Troutdale were down because of the storm. The pavement along the Columbia River highway above Crown Point was covered with ice, sleet and snow and in a number of places trees had fallen across the highway.

At Chehalis, Washington, snow fell all day Saturday and the streets were extremely slushy yesterday.

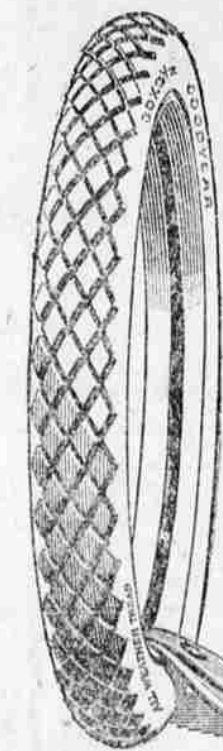
