MILLIONS ASKED FOR SCHOOLS

MANILA, P. I., Nov. 22.—The director of education for the Philippine Islands, Luther B. Bewley, has prepared an estimate which will be placed before the coming session of the legislature in October, asking for an appropriation of \$4,250,000 for the public schools in 1922.

This sum added to the allotment of \$4,000,000 covering a period of five years, makes a total of \$8,250,000 asked for public education in 1922, exclusive of the appropriation for the University of the Philippines and its provincial colleges.

Director Bewley says it is desired to employ more American teachers, to increase the salaries of Filipino teachers, to establish more special schools and to construct additional school buildings.

power. That was based on the fleets as they were November 11, as the "zero hour" for application of a cut and the decade of no building. The Japanese contend, it is understood, that the battleship Mutsu, proposed to be scrapped, was so nearly finished that she should be retained. In that event it seems highly probable that the United States would retain one or more of the new battleships now afloat, but which she has offered to scrap. The point has not been threatened out as yet by experts, however, nor has Japan definitely committed herself. It is held, to the "five-five-three" replacement ratio.

Representations were understood to have been made by British and Japanese experts as to the effect the American plan would have in connection with the obsolescence of ships during the 10-year period, the shape each navy would be in at that time, and other technical questions. It was said in some quarters that the American group admitted that all of these considerations were not fully reviewed in shaping the proposal. In any case, however, the British have given unqualified endorsement, according to authorized British spokesmen, to the fundamental principle of the American plan, the "five-five-three" ratio and settlement of this vital first point awaits Japan's final answer. American opinion regards other matters largely as routine.

TRAIN SERVICE CONTINUES DISRUPTED

night was snowed in at Fallbridge early this afternoon.

A bridge was washed out at Sever on the Oregon Electric. The Woodburn-Springfield branch of the S. P. is completely stalled. Twenty feet of snow had fallen in the Columbia gorge, an ice crust making clearing difficult. A snow plow sent from Portland Saturday afternoon stuck in the snow and ice a mile east of Multnomah Falls.

Plows Stick in Snow.

Another plow was headed that way in an effort to dig the blockaded one out. Two relief trains were sent early today in an effort to reach the blockaded passengers in the Columbia gorge.

A river steamer brought 250 passengers from Bonneville last night and returned today to get those marooned at Multnomah Falls.

Dam Breaks.

MOLLALA, Oregon, Nov. 22.—The new \$40,000 waterworks dam at Trout creek broke yesterday. Mollala streets were flooded and nearly all ranches below the dam were also flooded. Many fled from their homes.

Enormous Damage.

PENDLETON, Nov. 22.—Many thousands of dollars of damage, the total extent of which is impossible to form an estimate, has been incurred in Pendleton and Umatilla county as a result of the heaviest November snow storm that has fallen in this section in the state during the past 25 years.

Two feet of snow fell and covered growing buildings, broke telephone and telegraph wires, impeded street traffic almost completely blocked rail traffic and caused the collapse of some roofs when the storm let up in its fury Sunday night about 10 o'clock.

Not for 25 years has Pendleton had such a heavy snow so early in the season, according to the testimony of old residents. In 1896, 25 years ago, there was a two-foot snowfall, on November 7. The thermometer sagged to 20 below zero at that time, and thousands of head of cattle and sheep were frozen to death.

Stock May Suffer.

The livestock industry faces heavy damages in some cases if the storm does not abate soon. According to leading livestock men, there are some cattle and sheep which have been caught away from feed, and every effort is being made now to get hay or straw to these stranded herds and bands.

Damage estimated at \$10,000 occurred this morning when the roof of the Clemens & Ebert implement store on East Court street crashed under the weight of the snow.

The Happy Canyon pavilion proved the first casualty in Pendleton when the roof caved in under the weight of the snow yesterday forenoon. About 11 o'clock a portion of the roof went down and later in the day more of the roof fell. As a result the entire pavilion is a wreck, the roof having fallen in upon the dance floor and the walls being damaged by the caving.
