Bandits Shoot Store Keeper To Death in Idaho Falls Saturday

OGDEN, Utah, Nov. 29.—Stephen A. Browning, 62 years of age, a business man of Idaho Falls, Idaho, was shot to death by bandits Saturday night, according to a message received late Saturday night by relatives in Ogden.

It was learned through telephone conversation with Idaho Falls police headquarters that the storekeeper was found dead in his store by a customer shortly after 9 o'clock. There were four bullet wounds in the body. By the storekeeper's side was his gun with one cartridge discharged. The theory is that bandits entered the store to rob Browning and he was shot when he resisted.

A woman said she saw two men running from the store a few minutes before the body was found, according to the police.
