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GERMANS GET HIGH WAGES

In All Industries Wage Scales said to be Higher than in Pre-War Days.

COBLENZ, Germany, Nov. 10. — Workmen in most parts of Germany are said now to be receiving better wages, everything considered, than prior to the war, and working shorter hours. This is particularly true of the occupied area, according to American army officers who in their line of duty have come in contact with the German working classes. That the workman is able to live better under present conditions is due, in a large measure, to the fact that strict regulations of food prices has been enforced by German authorities and has prevented shopkeepers from hoarding the cost of the necessities of life, despite depreciation in the value of the war. These regulations apply chiefly to house rent, meat, potatoes and other staples produced within the country. Many luxuries have increased in price, especially within the last few weeks when the mark took a tumble.

Baker Played Lone Hand.

It has been an annual custom for the coaches of the Baker, La Grande and Pendleton high school teams after the season to confer and jointly select an all-star mythical team or squad naming the best players of the teams seen in action and publishing their joint selections as the official All Eastern Oregon team. This year the Baker City representative claiming a wider range of vision went into conference with himself and selected his official all-star team. This selection was published prior to Thanksgiving day in the Baker papers. After the game Turkey day between their respective teams, coaches Lodell and Hanley conferred and passed judgment on the star performers of the various teams witnessed in action by each of the two coaches. The result was the following selection:

Right End, Alstott, La Grande.
Left End, Snyder, Pendleton.
Alternate, Gent, Elgin.
Right Tackle, F. Kramer, Pendleton.

Left Tackle, Langrell, Baker.
Alternate, Rogers, Pendleton.
Right Guard, Savage, Baker.
Left Guard, Bean, La Grande.
Alternate, McGinnis, Wallowa.
Center, Lawrence, Pendleton.
Quarter, Cahill, Pendleton.
Alternate, Stoddard, Baker.
Left Half, Capt. W. Kramer, Pendleton.

Right Half, Chambers, Prairie City.
Alternate, Heyden, Pendleton.
Fullback, Newton, Pendleton.
Alternate, Manary, Baker.
Eligible Man, Adkisson, Pendleton.

Utility back, Reider, Baker.
In commenting on the Baker coach's selection, both the La Grande and Pendleton directors disagreed with the Baker mentor's statement that there was a dearth of line material and a wealth of backs. Both coaches believed from their last year's experience that the facts of the case are diametrically opposite.

Weakness Recognized.
For with the exception of Capt. Kramer of Pendleton this year's all of backs were woefully weak in comparison to the all star aggregation on the various Eastern Oregon eleven of last year. For example none of the field generals this year could even begin to fill the shoes of Myron Hanley, Pendleton's 1920 field strategist and this year's captain and star performer of the V. W.'s championship freshman team who by the way was rated as about the best man ever seen in this locality, excelling in all departments of kicking, a dangerous man carrying the ball and a field general extraordinary. Also the versatile Tunnilliffes last years Baker star. Likewise Horstman, La Grande's star performer. Terzoni, a wonder on both defense and offense and Pendleton's captain. Savage a hard hitting fullback. Stendal, a fast and flashy half who made opponents look slow. Wade a dependable Enterprise back. In comparison to the above players this year's backs with one or two exceptions look woefully weak.

Good Line Material.
On the other hand the line material was the bright spot in the conference. Men like F. Kramer of Pendleton, Langrell of La Grande, Savage of Baker, Lawrence of Pendleton, Bean of La Grande, McGinnis of Wallowa, Alstott of La Grande, Gent of Elgin, Snyder of Pendleton, Eccles of Baker and hosts of others made mediocre backs star because of their ability to open holes and made every team in Eastern Oregon a primarily defensive team.

In selecting an all star team this year we departed from the regular custom of picking a first and second team," Lodell said today. Competition was so close that it would be an injustice to some players to place them on a second team. Instead we selected a first team with an alternate for a position. Our reasons

for our selections are as follows:

"At center, Lawrence, Pendleton's lucky center stands out as the class of Eastern Oregon. He is by far the most accurate passer, cool and steady at all times. On defensive he shows a wonderful ability to diagnose plays and stack them back of the line of scrimmage. His only close competitor was Savage of Baker, who on account of his great defensive ability was chosen as a guard."

"Savage and Bean would make an ideal combination of guards. Both are powerful, fast and experienced. Both would be demons on offense and could open great holes for their backs on offense. Savage with his backfield experience would be one of the most valuable men on the team being able to play any position. McGinnis a big fellow from Wallowa is the closest competitor, although a tackle with Eccles, he is only following."

"Manner and Langrell of Baker stand out as two of the best ever developed at tackle position and are closely pressed by their alternate Rogers of Pendleton. All three are big and fast. Langrell an all Eastern Oregon selection from last year has an uncanny ability to diagnose plays and because of this ability would be named line captain. F. Kramer is an equally good tackle whose drive and charge makes him invaluable on offense and defense. Rogers would give either a run for his money had he been able to participate in all the games, being the biggest lineman in Eastern Oregon and one of the best kickers."

"At ends Snyder of Pendleton and Alstott of La Grande lead the field with Gent of Elgin and Adkisson of Pendleton closely following. Snyder's feet is his speed and ability to catch passes. Alstott being the strongest defensive end in Eastern Oregon. Gent of Elgin was a crack man as was Adkisson of Pendleton."

"At quarter Cahill of Pendleton gets the call over Stoddard of Baker, chiefly through the fact that he out-generaled the latter when their two teams met Armistice Day. Cahill is cool level headed and confident in his selection of plays. He is also a good pass hurler or receiver and a fierce tackler on defense, carrying the ball fairly well. Stoddard however is his equal in every department with the exception of selecting his plays."

"At halfback Bill Kramer is the best bet in Eastern Oregon. Unstoppable on offense plays, a vicious line backer and the best man in Eastern Oregon to carry the ball with three or four men hanging to him puts him in a class with last year's backs. The next best backs are Chambers of Prairie City and Heyden of Pendleton. The former is fast, aggressive, a good man in broken end field and a crack man on either end of the forward pass. He would make an ideal running mate for Capt. Bill Kramer. Heyden, Pendleton's captain-elect is a big powerful youngster who is chosen as alternate, pushes both men for their position, and with this year's experience should be among the best in the state next year. He is the best man running interference under observation this year."

"Reider of Baker is a star also but is handicapped by the lack of weight. He is the fastest man returning kicks in a broken field in Eastern Oregon."

"At fullback Newton earns his position because of his fine plunging ability and his educated toes. He is among the best of kickers seen this year."

"Manary's passing ability and runs from kick formation makes him a valuable understudy."

"This team has everything a team needs and fortunate would be the coach who could collect a squad like the above. With an invincible line, to check opponents and open holes and smashing driving backs, to gain ground, a great machine could be developed."

"With Kramer backing up the line with Savage helping if a roving center was used and Chambers returning punts what a defensive team this would be. With Bean, F. Kramer, Savage and Langrell opening holes, how Newton would plow through for yardage. With substitutes like McGinnis, Rogers, Gent, Adkisson, Stoddard, Heyden, Manary and Reider, a coach would need practically as strong a man in at any time. The life of such a coach would indeed be a happy one."

"Other star performers who deserve honorable mention are Eccles of Baker, Earnheart of Pendleton, Johnson of Wallowa, Banister of Athena in the line; Wercome of Burns, Sherwood of La Grande, Cameron of Milton, Larson of La Grande, Johnson of Elgin and Harden of Athena in the backfield."

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
