The night school has 19 enrolled in three classes — bookkeeping stenography and English for foreigners. In the English class there are 5 Greeks who are learning to speak, read and write our language and are incidentally learning to be good, loyal American citizens.

The membership roll now consists of 241 men, 104 women and girls and 120 boys, a total of 465. The 16 rooms are occupied now by 18 men. In addition to these there are many men and women who make occasional use of the building for committee meetings. Several hundred men and boys make use of the reading room where the best of current magazines and newspapers are kept on file.

The Union County Ad Club and Boy Scouts, and La Grande Ministerial Association make their headquarters in the building.
