W. S. HART AT SHERRY'S FOR LAST TIMES TODAY

William S. Hart's latest Paramount picture of the west, "O'Malley of the Mounted," scored a triumph at its presentation at the Sherry Theatre last night. It is certainly one of the strongest character portrayals with which Mr. Hart has favored his followers in many months, to say the least.

Thrills abound throughout the action of this virile photoplay. TEST A SUCCESS

NORFOLK, Va., Dec. 5. — The first official test of helium gas in large airships was completed successfully Thursday when the naval dirigible C-7 returned here after two long flights.
