Huge Opium Seizure In Shanghai Reported

SHANGHAI, Dec. 7.—The biggest opium seizure achieved in years by the police of the International Settlement of Shanghai was brought about in October when a ten-ton truck, the property of a prominent foreign firm, was halted as it was traversing the business district and searched. Two-

ty-four packing cases containing opium valued at \$284,000 Mex. were found on the truck and confiscated. It was found that the real smugglers, who escaped arrest, had bribed the driver of the truck to move the opium from a warehouse in which it had been stored. The opium with a quantity of other narcotics the authorities have seized in recent months was destroyed by burning in the municipal kilns at Pootung.

MACHINE TO CLEAR HIGHWAY

PORTLAND, Dec. 7.—If a plan advanced by Roadmaster Katchel meets with the approval of the county commissioners, an attempt will be made to melt the snow and ice on the Columbia River highway with a machine invented by Katchel.

Katchel claims to have perfected a machine that will throw a flame five or six feet long and twelve inches in diameter. The machine, he says, will melt a passage way through the snow which now blocks the highway at points beyond MIST falls.

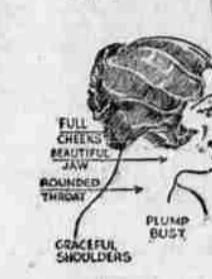
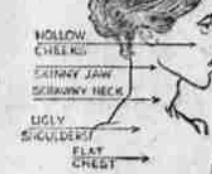
Should the commissioners decide that immediate action is necessary, Katchel may be given authority to go ahead with his plan.
