Dear Mr. Williamson, I want to congratulate you on the wonderful submarine pictures you show in your new photoplay, "Wet Gold."

Your clear undersea photography showing divers entering and leaving a submarine boat to roam about the ocean floor is amazing. Very few laymen are familiar with the functioning of under-sea boats, but they can now see with their own eyes precisely how it is operated.
