

WALLULA CUTOFF IS DISTANT

Section in Highway Laws Discovered That May Help Defer it a Long Time, Says Pendletonian.

PENDLETON, Dec. 14.—Eastern Oregon need not fear the construction of the Wallula cut-off at any near date, according to discovery of a section in the highway laws of 1917 requiring the vote of the state highway commission to be unanimous when a state highway is designated. Since the state highway commission is given the authority of designating the roads upon which the federal appropriation may be expended, and since W. A. Barratt, commissioner from Eastern Oregon has positively declared himself unalterably opposed to the cut-off proposal, the local committees working against the proposal feel confident of victory.

John B. Yeon, commissioner from Portland, is known to favor the cut-off and Commissioner R. A. Booth's position is rather doubtful, but even should Booth favor the plan it would be held up by Barratt's vote, according to local lawyers interviewed yesterday.

The actual wording of the state highway legislation covering this point is as follows:

"Upon the selection of state highways as hereafter provided for, the decision of the commissioners must be unanimous; and in case said commissioners are unable to so agree, the governor of the state of Oregon shall have the right to vote as a member of said commission."

It is thought here that it would be extremely unlikely that the governor would vote in case of a dispute, and if he did vote for the cut-off proposal, a local lawyer declared that there would still be a legal question as to what the last phrase of the law implied.

Senator Ritter before leaving for Portland stated that he placed this provision in the state laws to protect just such a contingency as now seems to exist; the possibility of two commissioners trading against a third. Since the action of the Portland chamber of commerce in endorsing the cut-off proposal, those in charge of the opposing fight are planning to appear directly before the commission.

GRAIN GROWERS TO MOVE OFFICE

Co-operative Organization of Northwest Will Make its Headquarters in Portland

SPOKANE, Wash., Dec. 14.—Final decision to move the offices of the Northwest Wheat Growers' association from Spokane to Portland within the next 60 days was announced today following a two-day session of the board of directors. The move, it is said, is being made in the interests of economy and will eliminate one office of the organization.

The following officers will transfer their activities from Spokane: George C. Jewett, general manager; C. W. Nelson, sales manager; Gaston J. Levy, head of the grading department; and A. Rickles, head of the statistical department.

About half the office force is affected by the change. A few of the clerks may be taken to Portland, but most of them will lose their jobs, as clerical help will be recruited in Portland.

Under the new plans the Spokane office in the new Madison building will be headquarters of the Washington-Idaho Wheat Growers' association, with sales representative of the northwest association to handle local sales to mills. Walter J. Robinson, manager of the Washington-Idaho association, will be in charge in Spokane.

The headquarters of the Farmers' union, the North Idaho Growers' Warehousing corporation, the Washington Growers Warehousing corporation and the Farmers' Union Mutual Fire Insurance company are not affected by the change. All will continue to make their headquarters in Spokane with their respective officers in charge.

C. W. Nelson, sales manager, will make his headquarters in Seattle. Mr. Jewett will handle sales in Portland. Headquarters of the Northwest or-

ganization have been in Spokane since organization last June.
