INDIA COMING STEEL PRODUCER

(By Associated Press) LONDON, Dec. 20.—India will soon be able to produce the cheapest steel in the world, says an announcement by two British firms which have undertaken to organize the "United Steel Corporation of India, Ltd." They propose to establish, as soon as possible, works on a large scale, near deposits of iron, coal and limestone. Iron ore of high quality, fluxes of suitable character, and excellent cooking coal occur close together in Bihar and Orissa, the companies state, and the cost of these materials is much lower than has to be paid for them in other steel-producing countries. The plant to be erected in India is designed to produce eventually 600,000 to 700,000 tons of pig iron, with steel works and rolling mills capable of producing 450,000 tons of finished steel a year.

BULL FIGHTS MAY BE BANNED

(By Associated Press) MEXICO CITY, Dec. 20.—The newspaper, El Universal, has started a campaign against bull fighting which appears to give promise of possible success. In the belief that the present generation of grownups enjoys the sport so much that its prohibition is impossible, the newspaper is attempting to keep children away from the fights and to that end has placed the mayor of Mexico City and the governor of the Federal District, in which Mexico City is located, on record as opposed to boys and girls witnessing the "brutal sport." Quarter-page pictures of youngsters eagerly watching the gory sights of the arena have been printed and the newspaper asks if this is the sort of environment that makes for culture and refinement. Felix Palavicini, editor of El Universal, long ago placed himself on record as unalterably opposed to bullfights, although, in deference to popular opinion, his newspaper carries exhaustive accounts of the corridos. He argues, however, that if the youngsters are now kept away from the fights the next generation will not want them.

LETTER SENT TO HARDING

(By Associated Press) BERLIN, Dec. 20.—In a letter to President Harding, sent from Berlin on the eve of the disarmament conference, the Field Committee for Germany of the Society of American and English Friends, popularly known as "Quakers," expresses the conviction that there is now not only a spiritual possibility, but also an economic need for laying down of all weapons of war. "The present moment," says the letter, "is one peculiarly favorable for international action and unless this is taken now the history of Western civilization may end in terror." The letter is signed by Francis J. Bacon, chairman of the Field Committee, which has been supervising Quaker relief work in Germany for the past two years.
