### Harding Makes Appeal For More Economy

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—President Harding has directed that a general meeting of the business organizations of the government, to discuss administrative economy, be called during the latter part of January, it was announced Wednesday by Director of the Budget Dawes.

was the president's purpose to call these meetings semi-annually. They will be similar to the one held last June, which was attended by all administrative government officials from the president down to bureau chiefs. The president's immediate purpose in calling the January meeting, Mr. Dawes said, is to give persons instructions in connection with the administration economy policy. The president also, Mr. Dawes stated, will outline the method which he desires followed in connection with compliance with the provisions of the act of February 27, 1906, which provides a penalty for the creation of a deficiency by a government official. This act, which has never been enforced, provides that a government official responsible for the expenditures of any sum in excess of appropriations made by congress for that fiscal year may be punished by a fine on not less than \$100 or by imprisonment for not less than one month.
