WINTER LUBRICATION FOR AUTOMOBILES

Is your engine hard to crank these cold mornings? Does the self-starter turn it over very slowly and exhaust your storage battery?

If you have noticed these conditions in your engine, it is likely that you are not using the correct oil for winter lubrication.

In cold weather it is of particular importance that the oil flows readily, otherwise it will not lubricate properly.

As oil becomes cold, it thickens, and eventually congeals. The lowest temperature at which the oil will flow is called its "Cold Test."

If your car has been standing long enough the temperature of the oil in the engine will approximate that of the surrounding air. If this temperature is below the cold test of the oil, the oil will be entirely congealed.

If the temperature is not much above the cold test of the oil, the oil will be so heavy and sluggish that it will hardly flow. The connecting rod and crankshaft bearings and the pistons are set in a film or wholly or partially congealed oil requiring an extra strain on your storage battery in operating the self-starter.

It is able to crank the engine only at a much lower speed than usual, and as a result, your engine does not start readily.

After the engine has been started it is necessary to run it for some time before the oil in the
