Irrigation Is Growing.

Few appreciate the rapid growth of irrigation in Oregon, both as to acreage and districts embraced. For instance during 1921 nine districts in the state were completed with a total acreage of 107,950, this land lying in Hood River, Malheur, Klamath, Crook, Jackson, and Deschutes counties. In almost every acre of the above total, land heretofore useless was made to blossom. L. M. Jensen, in his talk to the Ad Club Tuesday, gave figures to show that there are 61 irrigation districts in the state at the present time, in which about 300,000 acres are irrigated and nearly a million acres that need it will get water just as soon as the projects are finished.

LA GRANDE LAD IS INVENTOR

Le Roy Leishman Has Improved Picture Telegraphy Recently.

Word was received here recently of the success of LeRoy J. Leishman of Ogden, Utah, a former La Grande boy, as an inventor. A telegram instrument whereby picture telegraphy is made easy is the invention to his credit. The Los Angeles Express in a recent feature article had the following to say regarding Leishman's invention: "Pictures of great events in Europe or the eastern states transmitted by telegraph to Los Angeles in 10 minutes is one of the modern marvels that will be afforded readers of the Express through the Leishman Telegraph Picture Service, using a new and perfect system of picture telegraphy invented by LeRoy J. Leishman of Ogden, Utah."

"In order that the people of the city may have an opportunity to see how picture telegraphy works, Alex Pantages has arranged for an interesting demonstration of the device at the New Pantages theater next Friday. A demonstration will be given at the afternoon matinee, and again in the evening at 6:30 o'clock."

"The Leishman Service uses three different systems of photo-telegraphy, two of them automatic and one of them a code system. Each of them transmits a picture as perfectly as to be indistinguishable from the ordinary newspaper picture taken from a photograph."

"The automatic machine system was perfected in 1915 and the code system invented in 1917. The United States government made use of the system during the war and recognized telegraphic photography as a valuable adjunct to military strategy."

"Operators for the system are being trained in London, Paris, Rome and Berlin and in every large city in the United States, and from these sources the Express readers will have a regular picture service of world news events."

"Besides having invented the picture telegraph, LeRoy J. Leishman has mathematical and electrical inventions in practical use in 29 countries. He is the inventor of the archæoscope, an instrument used in connection with higher mathematics and mechanical drawings in one-fourth of the colleges of the United States and more than 1000 high schools."

"The demonstration at the New Pantages will be given by transmitting pictures across the stage through the Leishman automatic system. The spotlight will be played on blank sheets of paper, and the transmitting of pictures from across the stage to the blank paper will be shown. The process is exactly the same as though one instrument were in London and the other in New York."

Leishman is a son of John Leishman, bookkeeper at the sugar factory here when that was operating.
