## LIGHT SERVICE BEING IMPROVED

Large Amount Being Spent in Renewing Poles and Other Service Equipment in La Grande.

The E. O. L. & P. Co. is making extensive improvements in its system this winter. Considerable work has been done in various parts of the valley last year and the erection of new poles along Adams avenue is now progressing rapidly. These poles will be painted, improving the appearance of the street. About \$2,000 will be required to complete this work on Adams avenue and a total of \$15,000 will be spent in La Grande during the next year for similar work and for additional improvements.

During the last year over twelve miles of new poles have been erected in the Grande Ronde valley in addition to a thorough going-over of the whole system which includes about seventy miles of transmission lines besides the distribution lines in the various towns. The system is in good condition and is capable of giving the best service possible to its customers, J. P. Lottridge, general manager, said today.

In 1921 the E. O. L. & P. Co.'s business in this valley showed a material improvement and plans are being made to keep well in advance of the demands that will be made upon the company so as to have unlimited service.

The plans for this year include a complete survey of the street lighting system in La Grande, with the intention of recommending necessary improvements, and a survey of the service conditions with the view of giving customers every improvement possible. The expenditure for this year will include about \$40,000, above the regular running expenses, which will be used in the Grande Ronde valley on improvements and additional maintenance. About \$15,000 of this sum will be spent in La Grande.

"The E. O. L. & P. Co. is doing everything possible to improve its service to the public," said Mr. Lottridge, general manager of the company.

#### Tourist Meeting Important.

The tourist committee of the Ad Club is elated over the fact that La Grande is to be officially represented tomorrow at the meeting in Spokane where will be reached some uniform and practical means of operating auto tourist camps. The day of free and bazaarist tourist camps is gone, and the great danger heretofore has been of overdone facilities in one community and underdone at others. The general purpose of the meeting at Spokane, called to unite the entire northwest in the matter of tourist facilities, is to devise reasonable means for handling the auto traffic.

"A good service, but not free service," is the general slogan everywhere, and City Commissioner David I. Stoddard will no doubt be one of those who will advocate first class service, and a reasonable fee for same.

Immediate action by the city of La Grande toward handling this problem locally should follow the return of the representative. Once uniform plans for the northwest are adopted, La Grande cannot afford to lose another week before starting her machinery in that direction. In less than four months the stream of tourists will commence and unless this city suffer serious consequences she must make provisions this winter and spring for the "crop." The city park camp is wholly inadequate and cannot be used another year.

### Water Vapor Saves Fuel Says Instructor

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Jan. 6.—Fuel may be saved by increasing the amount of water vapor in the atmosphere at home, according to Miss Emma Weid, instructor in the household arts department at the Oregon Agricultural college. The lower temperature in which it is possible to live comfortably when the amount of water vapor in the air is increased, is also healthful, she explained.

"An average temperature of 64 to 68 degrees has been shown to be best for the human race," said Miss Weid. "The skin is more healthful at this temperature, the body more hearty and the constitution better able to resist disease. Experiments conducted in the New York schools a few years ago proved this fact conclusively.

"A large amount of water in the air, or a high humidity, makes a person feel as warm at 64 degrees as he would in dry air at 70 or 73 degrees. Moisture does not evaporate quickly from the body and heat is thus saved in the body as well as coal for the furnace."

### Three Fined for Imbibing Too Much
