HISTORIC PIANO IS RECOVERED

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 7.—Back in San Francisco's gold days a noted place here was the El Dorado saloon, one of the most luxuriously-equipped resorts in America, and one of its attractions was a beautiful square piano, with fittings of silver and keys of pearl.

When the El Dorado closed, its owner, Colonel Thomas Jefferson Chambers, meeting with reverses, sold the piano to his friend, Senator John Fay, for \$750. The Senator's children, John Fay, Luke Fay and Miss Mamie, learned their music on the piano, came to love it and regard it as a part of their family, and once, when the piano tuner opened its mysteries to them, they wrote their family's name and address and Punch, the name of their dog, inside the top board.

Finally the piano passed into other hands, Senator Fay replacing it with a later model organ when the children were away at college. When the three returned they did not like the new piano as they did the old and often wished they had the old instrument back.

Years passed and the three children grew up. Not long ago Luke Fay and his wife were planning to buy a new piano for their daughter, Mary, for Christmas, when one day the telephone rang in their home. A lady was calling and she gave her name as Mrs. J. P. Maguire, of Oakland, California.
