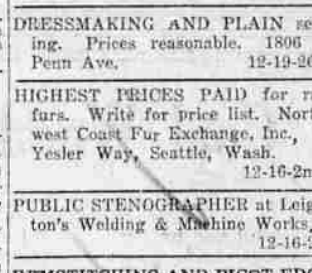

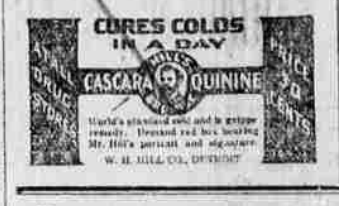


## FLOUR TUMBLES

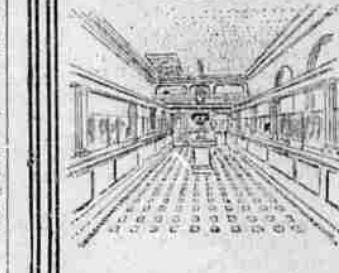
