large supply is reported in Louisiana storage houses.

Pruning and spraying of orchards are making rapid progress in California. Fruit trees were damaged by the November ice storm in New England, but efforts are being made to repair the damage. The cold weather of December 27 caused considerable anxiety among strawberry growers in White County, Ark. Interest in strawberry growing is developing rapidly in Calcasieu Parish, La.

#### Stock Flourishes.

The health and condition of all classes of live stock are generally good, due to the mild weather which has prevailed and to the feed which, with a few exceptions, has been abundant. Some loss of cattle and horses is reported throughout the corn belt from moldy corn and cornstalk disease. Some cholera is reported, but in general the disease is now well under control. The number of cattle and sheep on feed in Colorado is reported to be less than last year. The demand for feeder lambs exceeds the supply in some sections of Idaho.

Young clover generally entered the winter in good condition. New grass has made excellent growth in California and promises abundant feed. Hanges are good in Texas and fair in New Mexico, but more rain is needed in New Mexico. A shortage of hay and forage is reported in Virginia and North Carolina, due to the dry summer and autumn. Tame hay is below requirements in Wisconsin and is being supplemented with marsh hay.

### LEGION REACHES FOREIGN LANDS

INDIANAPOLIS, Jan. 10. — With 10,754 posts in 48 states, five territorial possessions, and 29 foreign countries, the American Legion enters upon the year 1922. During the past 12 months, 776 posts were added to the organization, according to a report given out by Lenuel Bolles, national adjutant.

The Legion is pushing its way into every corner of the earth. Eleven of the posts added during 1921 were outside the boundaries of the United States. These were: Fort Gibbon, Tanana, Alaska; Andornach, Germany; Guatemala City, Guatemala; Luke Field, Hawaii; Escondido, Lower California, Mexico; San Juan, Porto Rico; Losada, Angola, Portuguese West Africa; Telo, Spanish Honduras; Maracalho, Venezuela; Warsaw, Poland; and Constantinople, Turkey.

The greatest increase was noted through the middle west and southwest, statistics at national headquarters show. Texas led the list of new posts with 60, followed by Kansas with 57, and Ohio with 55. The next eight states in order were: Pennsylvania, Iowa and Mississippi (tied), Wisconsin, Oklahoma, Indiana, Nebraska and Michigan.

"The Legion's growth during 1921 is remarkable in view of the deplorable unemployment among ex-service men," said Bolles. "With the return to normal conditions we expect to double our membership."

### EXCISE TAX IS HELD UNLAWFUL

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Jan. 10. — The excise taxes imposed by North Dakota within the state were held by the supreme court Monday to be invalid.

The case in which the decision was rendered was on appeal from the United States district court, which sustained a tax assessed upon the business of railroads within the state. The tax was opposed on the ground that it was levied on interstate commerce and for a period within which the railroads were under federal control.

The tax was imposed upon the entire stock and bond issues of the company in proportion to the value of the business transacted by them within the state to the value of their entire business.

(By Associated Press) CHICAGO, Jan. 10.—Five armed men who Sunday night passed as policemen took control of the Great Lakes building in the downtown district, imprisoned four men they found in the building, and looted the stores of A. Arend Drug company of 40 cases of whiskey, were Monday still at liberty. One of the robbers released the prisoners before departing.

### Passing Of Delegate To Congress Marked By Hawaiian Rites

(By Associated Press) HONOLULU, T. H., Jan. 10.—Lighted by the flare from native "kukui" torches and guarded by descendants of the chieftains, the body of Jonah Kūhio Kalanianoʻole, territorial delegate from Hawaii to congress, was taken from the Waikiki home to the Kawaiaho church, a distance of four miles, where it will lie in state surrounded by brilliant peacock feathers, the Kahili's emblems of rulership in Hawaii, until Saturday night, when it will be transferred to Iolani palace prior to the burial Sunday.

The Hawaiian custom of transferring the dead is at night, especially among royalty.

#### In Prince's Memory.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 10.—The home adjourned Monday on convening out of respect to Prince Kūniamanole, delegate to congress from Hawaii whose death occurred Saturday at Honolulu. In announcing the death, Representative Curry, Republican, California, referred to the delegate as a "patriotic American and splendid representative of his people."
