COLLEGES ARE MORE POPULAR

More Efficiently Needed in Work and Better grade of Instruction Says Professor.

(By Associated Press)

EVANSTON, Ill., Jan. 12.—Never has there been a time when so many youth are knocking at the college door; the attendance at institutions of higher learning having increased about 35 per cent in five years; never before has so much money been given by public spirited men for the upbuilding of these institutions, and it behooves educators to carefully figure whether or not the output of our institutions is up to proper standard grade. President Samuel Plantz, of Lawrence college, Appletton, Wis., told the educational association of the Methodist Episcopal church in session here today.

"It is by no means an easy matter to judge of the efficiency of a college," continued Prof. Plantz. "In the first place the canons or principles of judgment used in testing business efficiency will not apply. There are many who feel that the American college is putting out a very poor scholarly product. On the other hand there are men who criticize the college from the standpoint of practical efficiency.

"A New York banker in sympathy with higher education has made the comment: 'Apart from the fact that the college does not teach young men anything that will be useful to them in business, my observation has made me suspect that it is deficient in another important particular, namely that the young men are not taught accuracy, perseverance, and an insatiable appetite for hard work.'

"The college finds its mission in the true ends of education, which I conceive to be chiefly two; first, to acquaint the individual with the spiritual possessions of the race; that is its literature, its art, its sciences, its history. It thus helps meet the highest needs of the student's nature, that of self-development.

"The second end of education is to assist the individual to fulfill the practical demands of life in the accomplishment of such tasks or callings as will enable him to care for the physical needs of himself and of those dependent upon him, and perform faithfully his duties as a member of human society. The college then, in brief, is to develop the man, and prepare him to get on in the practical affairs of life, and its efficiency cannot be judged from either standpoint without the other.

"If we want greater efficiency in college work, we must be more careful about opening too widely the front door. We must awake to the fact, before we undertake it, that we cannot make a mahogany table out of bass wood boards. The way to improve the quality of our product is to sort out the worthless material at the beginning.

"We cannot improve the product of our colleges in such a reorganization of the curriculum and by such correlations and combinations of subjects as will more closely relate its activities to the movements of life in the present time.

"The college can improve its product by paying more attention to the pedagogy of college teaching and by better educational teaching."

FIELD BEING IMPROVED.

Dirt is being dumped on the baselines of the infield from the east bank of the running track, which is thereby being widened. The Whitman field is the only one used by Northwest conference baseball teams which has a grass infield.

INTELLIGENCE RECORD MADE

SPOKANE, Wash., Jan. 12.—Not content with rating recently given it by the United States census bureau as the most "intelligent" city in the nation, Spokane now proposes to seek out the 567 illegals found by the census enumerators within its borders and better its record.

The matter has been brought before the educational committee of the chamber of commerce, which has promised to give the proposal its early attention. Meanwhile the public night schools, which have been in operation here for more than ten years, are planning to enlarge their operations to reach as many of the foreign born of the city as possible.

With this end view such of the 200 foreign born students in the night classes, most men and women, are being urged to induce their enrollment for the next term, and most of them have promised to bring at least one additional student.


During the last ten years, since accurate records of night school attendance have kept, total of 19, 153 persons have enrolled in the night classes. Allowing that such of there has been enrolled an average during two different terms, Frank H. Arnold, supervisor of public evening schools, estimates that one in every ten persons in the city's population of approximately 100, 000 has attended night school during the decade.

Of this total, he said, 3,741 foreign born have been enrolled during the last six years. Records as to foreign or native birth were not kept prior to that time.

ALBINO PRIZED.

GOLDENDALE, Wash., Jan. 12.—Pelts of albino wild animals are particularly prized by the Indians, according to Henry B. J. Meyer, postmaster at Sundale, in eastern Klickitat county, who conducts a trading post patronized by Columbia river Indians. Mr. Meyer reports seeing the pelt of an albino coyote, killed by Biv George, an Indian hunter and trapper. He offered several times the value of an ordinary coyote pelt, but the Indian refused all offers, saying the skin would be preserved by a secret tribal process, and handed down from generation to generation for use in tribal ceremonies.
