AT SHERRYS—LAST DAY

"The Witching Hour" Scores Hit At Local Theatre.

A picture that makes you think; that grips your attention from the first reel and holds it without a break till the final fade-out—that is "The Witching Hour," a new Paramount picture. It is a smooth, even vehicle that puts over powerfully the message that thoughts are actual forces. Elliott Dexter as "Jack Brookfield" gives an impersonation quite different from that of John Mason, who created the role on the stage, but one equally impressive. The rest of the cast is excellent and supports Mr. Dexter splendidly in the difficult action of the drama. Also showing a comedy.

WAS SHAKESPEARE BEHIND "MAN-WOMAN-MARRIAGE"?

"Man-Woman-Marrriage," Allen Hoobar's Associated First National drama-sternal, starring Dorothy Phillips at the Arcade Theatre, is a picture inspired by the progress of modern woman and a sterling tribute to the attributes woman has always possessed despite nonrecognition by the modern dramatist.

Director Allen Hoobar, who produced this greatest of cinema dramas, received his inspiration not from writers nor exponents of suffrage but from tributes paid woman centuries ago by the great dramatists—William Shakespeare.

Throughout the greater works of this great scholar of human nature woman has been set before an admiring world as a figure of strength. Shakespeare's heroines have been strong women with the exception of Ophelia.

His Portia, Juliet, Rosalind, Desdemona, and even Lady Macbeth, were most energetic beings; they were the central and dominant figures of the intricate plots woven with such skill in Shakespeare's works have lived because of their humanness and not because of their historic value.

On this theory Allen Hoobar has woven this great drama about a woman—a woman of strength, but no stronger than any other woman who takes advantage of her natural characteristics. Dorothy Phillips as the girl, Victoria, ably demonstrates the strength with which women are imbued, but too often fails to recognize. Woman is weak through tradition and custom and not through actual enfeeblement.
