Cardinal Gasparri, papal secretary of state, is being spoken of here as a possible successor to Benedict. By virtue of his position, he has been in charge of the papal household and of the church since 6 o'clock Sunday morning...

In his responsible position of chamberlain during the obsequies of the pope and during the conclave, Cardinal Gasparri will be assisted by the deans of the three orders in which the cardinals are grouped...

Seventy in College. There are only six cardinal bishops to whom are entrusted the six dioceses immediately around Rome. Their dean is Cardinal Vincenzo Vannutelli...

The order of the cardinal priests would comprise 50 members if the sacred college had its full number of 70. The dean of this order is Cardinal Michael Logue, archbishop of Armagh, Ireland, who is 82.

The order of the cardinal deacons in a full sacred college would comprise 10 members. Their dean is Cardinal Gaetano Bisleti, for whom many thousands of Americans have a feeling of gratitude...

Selection of a new pope will have unusual interest for Italy, it was declared here, because in view of the decided conciliatory attitude taken by Benedict, there will be speculation as to whether his policy will be continued.

If Cardinal Gasparri should be chosen, a continuation of the same policy would be insured, but another cardinal might have different ideas. Cardinal Gasparri, according to the general opinion, has the greatest chances of success...

LORD BRYCE PASSED ON YESTERDAY

Roman Empire, was an expansion of the Arnold Prize Essay which he delivered at his graduation from Oxford.

Mr. Bryce practiced law in London for 15 years, and for 22 years was honored with the Regius Professorship of Civil Law at Oxford, the oldest chair in Europe, dating from 1516.

When he was first elected to the House of Commons in 1889 as a Liberal of the most pronounced type, Mr. Bryce was generally considered a failure as a political factor...

In 1886 he was appointed Under Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; he served as Chancellor for

the Duchy of Lancaster, which gave him a seat in the Gladstone Cabinet; and he was President of the Board of Trade in the Rosebery government...

At the age of 76 years when the European war broke out, Viscount Bryce enlisted in the service of his country by accepting an appointment as chairman of a special commission to investigate alleged atrocities committed by the Germans...

Throughout the conflict, the famous statesman, diplomat and author was active in many other efforts to ameliorate the condition of war victims, notably the Armenians and Poles...

In August, 1921, Lord Bryce in a lecture before the Institute of Politics at Williams College, Williamstown, Mass., declared the Treaty of Versailles had received nothing but censure in Europe and had resulted in "sowing the seeds of future wars."

The author of "The American Commonwealth," whom former premier Balfour once called "the greatest living authority on the American constitution," brought out another work in April, 1921, a two-volume book on "Democracy."

As a traveler, Lord Bryce had made himself known in all continents. He often spent several months of the year in jaunts to out-of-the-way places. For instance, in 1876 he visited western Asia and went down the Volga, and ultimately scaled Mount Ararat...

Lord Bryce's own story of how he came to write "The American Commonwealth," was told by him at a Pilgrims Society dinner in New York some years ago. He had read extensively of America for 17 years previous to his first visit here in 1870...
