ENROLLMENT IN SUNDAY SCHOOLS BIG

Methodists Have Nearly
Five Million in Sunday
Classes, Is Statement.

CHICAGO, Feb. 2.—There is a total enrollment of 4,750,762 pupils in the Sunday schools of the Methodist Episcopal Church, according to a statement made by the Rev. C. L. Hay, Research Secretary of the Board of Sunday Schools of the Methodist Episcopal Church at its annual meeting.

Bishop Thomas Nicholson presided and Bishop Homer C. Stuntz, of Omaha, Neb., and Bishop Frederick D. Leete, Indianapolis, Ind., took part in the meeting.

"The total enrollment for 1921 shows an increase of 283,262," said Rev. Hay. "The final tabulations for Sunday School statistics for 1921 are as follows:

"There are 35,463 schools with 401,135 officers and teachers. Of scholars of all grades there are 3,752,383. There are 236,572 members of the Home Department and 366,672 members of the Cradle Roll Department, a total enrollment of 4,750,762. The average attendance at the Sunday schools of Methodism is 2,376,733. Of the total enrollment, 2,092,735 pupils are members of the church and 378,428 officers and teachers are members of the church. There have been 200,796 accessions to the membership of the church from the Sunday school, and for school expenses including lesson leaves and literature, \$2,043,812 were spent. The net increase for 1921 according to Dr. Hay is 446 Sunday schools, 7,775 officers and teachers, 9,154 pupils in the Home Department, 22,891 pupils in the Cradle Roll, and 283,262 in total enrollment. Of this net gain there are 14,256 pupils belonging to the church, and there have been 2,289 accessions to the church from the Sunday school membership.

"The gain in total enrollment is the largest ever reported in a single year with the exception of 1909 and 1915, and exceeds by 70,189 the largest total enrollment ever previously reported. The number of schools exceeds the largest previous report by 161.

"At present 46,623 are enrolled in training classes and 3,587 in correspondence courses. The total number of adult Bible classes has reached 16,958."

ONE KILLED IN WRECK TUESDAY

COCHISE, Ore., Feb. 2.—One man was killed and six were injured when a logging train plucked 40 feet from a trestle into the Nehalem river, one and one-half miles east of here, at 4:10 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. The train, composed of the engine and one flat car, was carrying a crew of the Francis West Logging company from the

woods to the camp at Reliance. A. B. Parker of Cochran was the man killed.

The train left the trestle on a curve. Subsequent investigation showed that for some unknown reason the ties and rails of the track had slipped bodily from the trestle work, throwing first the engine and then the flat into the water. The engine fell partly in the water, where the fire caused steam which scalded the men imprisoned under the wreckage.

The scene of the accident was within seeing distance of the camp and men there were able to assist in the rescue. One difficult part of their task was jacking up the locomotive so that those of the crew caught beneath might be reached.

Lumber Company is
Reorganized and
Continues Business

PORTLAND, Feb. 2.—The Coon Bay Lumber company of Marshfield, a \$25,000,000 corporation, has been saved for Oregon and 1200 lumbermen kept out of the bread line as a result of the guidance of United States Judge Charles E. Wolverton.

Tuesday afternoon the company, which entered the receiver's hands January 17, 1919, was able not only to pay off a \$3,000,000 mortgage which fell due, but pay off all creditors in full with accumulated interest, as well as the salaries of all employees.

BLIZZARD IS RAGING IN EAST

SIOUX FALLS, S. D., Feb. 2.—South Dakota was Wednesday enduring the first genuine blizzard of the season. Fine snow and sleet driven by high winds are reported from all over the southern and central parts of the state. Temperatures, however, are not unusually low, averaging around 10 degrees above zero. Railroads leading into Sioux Falls report the majority of the trains only slightly overdue so far. Telegraph and telephone communication has not been seriously affected, according to reports from local offices.

three rooms and each Cardinal-Priest and Cardinal-Deacon two rooms. Telephones have been installed in the apartment of each of the Cardinals so they will be able to communicate with each other but this telephone ex-

change is not connected with the city exchange and there can be no telephone communication with the outside world.

The Cardinals will be walled in within the large hall of the Vatican, which is divided so as to provide these small compartments. At prescribed hours twice a day the Cardinals will come together to vote, the actual balloting taking place in the Sistine Chapel. This must continue until a candidate receives more than two-thirds of the vote. The ballots are burned after each indecisive vote is taken. Large crowds gather daily in the square of St. Peter to watch the smoke of the burning ballots issue from the chimney.

Failure to see the smoke at the usual time serves as a signal to the crowd that a new Pontiff has been chosen and the throng rushes inside the Basilica to await the appearance of the new head of the Church to appear on a balcony and bestow his first apostolic blessing. When the new Pope is chosen he is requested to select the name by which he is to be known thereafter.
