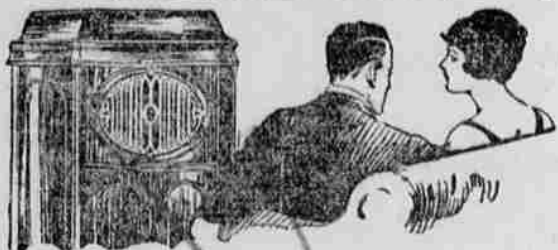
North Pole Mine Is Leased, Is Report
