ROTATING FUND FOR DOUGHBOYS

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Feb. 8.—Compiling the vital facts about the five million ex-service men in the United States is a job the American Legion is now undertaking in its national "service and compensation" drive, recently approved by the Legion's conference in Indianapolis. The drive is taking the form of a census, with each state department determining its own dates for carrying out the work.

To lay a foundation for the proposed "rotating fund" to be raised by the Legion for the benefit of ex-soldiers in acute circumstances, is a prime purpose of the census. Each veteran will be asked to specify whether he favors the establishment of such a fund and whether he is willing to contribute his compensation allotment, if he did not need it, with the

passage of bonus legislation. The money thus raised would be loaned to needy service men at a low rate of interest and with no security.

A further aim of the census is to record war disability cases. If a veteran was wounded or gassed, or was sick, or suffered an injury in the service, if he has an ailment that can be traced to service, he will register the facts on the questionnaire and assistance will be provided by the Legion in filing compensation claims. Every man will be urged to carry government insurance.

The census takers will also acquaint each man interviewed with the five provisions of the pending adjusted compensation bill and will ask him to name the choice. In this way an accurate forecast of the administration of the bill will be secured. Non-Legion men will be asked to become members, the aim of the organization being to eventually have every ex-soldier enrolled.

Income Tax Facts

Public officials, including those in the employ of the United States government, on state or any political subdivision thereof, are not required to pay federal income tax. However, all such public officials and employees must submit a return to the collector of internal revenue to become immune from taxation.

If the net income of a decedent from the beginning of the tax year to date of death was \$1000 or more in case of single persons and \$2000 in case of married persons or if the gross income be \$5000 or more, the executor or administrator must file a tax return.

Guardians or trustees also must file a tax return for their wards. March 15 is the last day for filing.

Surtax Rates.

Taxpayers are reminded that the surtax rates, which apply only to net income in excess of \$5,000, also are unchanged for the year 1921. Letters received by the bureau indicate the impression in the minds of the writers that the lowered surtax rates are applicable to net income for the calendar year 1921. Under the revenue act of 1921, the surtax rates for that year range from 1 per cent on the amount of net income between \$5,000 and \$6,000 to 65 per cent on the amount of net income in excess of \$1,000,000. For the calendar year 1922, the surtax rates range from 1 per cent on the amount of net income between \$5,000 and \$10,000, to 50 per cent by which the net income exceeds \$200,000.

The period for filing returns (if the taxpayer makes return on the calendar year basis) is from January 1 to March 15, 1922. This year, as last, the tax may be paid in full at the time of filing the return, or in four installments, due on or before March 15, June 15, September 15, and December 15. Forms 1040A for incomes of \$5000 and less, and 1040 for incomes in excess of \$5,000, will be sent to persons who last year filed returns of 1920 income. Failure to receive a form, however, does not relieve the taxpayer of his obligation to file a return and pay the tax within the time prescribed. Copies of these forms may be obtained at the offices of collectors of internal revenue, branch offices and banks.

The return, sworn to before a notary or other person authorized to administer an oath, must be filed with the collector of internal revenue for the district in which the taxpayer lives, or has his principal place of business.

Revenue officers will visit every county in the United States to aid taxpayers in making out their returns. Announcement of their arrival and the location of their offices will be made by collectors through the press. The services heretofore offered city residents will be continued.

ANNIVERSARY WILL BE SOON

(By Associated Press.) IOWA CITY, Ia., Feb. 8.—A diamond jubilee celebration at the University of Iowa on February 25 will commemorate the 75th anniversary of its establishment with an all-day program depicting the progress made by the institution during the three-quarters of a century.

A monster mass meeting will be held in the morning, taking the form of an historical review.

There also will be a distinctive and historically impressive pageant written for the occasion.

The University of Iowa was founded February 25, 1847, by an act of the first general assembly of the state legislature which approved the establishing and locating of the institution. First instruction was given in 1855, but the university did not begin its true functioning until 1857, when the state capital was moved from Iowa City to Des Moines. Amos Dean of the Albany Law school was its first president. The attendance this year will surpass the 6,100 mark and the faculty numbers 500.

STRAY DOGS ARE PUT ON FARMS

(By Associated Press.) CHICAGO, Feb. 8.—Many of Chicago's stray dogs of the streets, unhappy and sometimes dangerous in friendless environment, were placed on farms through Illinois last year by the Anti-Cruelty Society, John J. Abbot, its president, told the society's annual meeting here recently. The demand for dogs, he said, was greater than the society could fill.

Three coyotes also found home

through the society last year, he added. Dogs passing through its refuge in 1921 numbered 2,752 and cats 3,548.

A notable feature of 1921 was the humane day held in the public schools, Mr. Abbot continued. "With the cooperation of Superintendent of Schools Mortenson we arranged for a humane day which special exercises urging kindness to animals were held in every room of every school in Chicago," he said.
