NEW DANIELS PICTURE A GENTLE SATIRE ON MODERN-SPEED MANIA

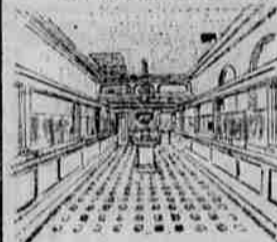
