FIRST BIBLE PRINTED HERE

Funds Solicited in England and Wales for America's First Home-published Bible.

CHICAGO, Feb. 14.—The first bible printed in the United States sprang directly from a national solicitation of funds in England and Wales in a manner somewhat akin to the Liberty Loan drives, according to George B. Utley, librarian of the Newberry Library here. The library has both the first American Bible and the Act of English Parliament which led to it.

This bible was a translation into the tongue of the Massachusetts Indians. For years John Eliot, a Puritan fleeing from persecution who landed 11 years after the Mayflower, had been sending back to England reports about missionary success among the Indians.

When the Puritans came into power he found a friendly government, and in 1645, within six months after Charles I was executed, when Cromwell was supreme Parliament passed "An act for promoting and propagating the Gospel in New England." This created a corporation consisting of 16 Londoners, which thereafter carried on this work.

But more especially it ordered "a general collection in all the countries, cities, towns and parishes of England and Wales." It required the ministers to read the act to their congregations and instructed them, with others, to "go with all convenient speed from house to house to every one of the inhabitants of the said parishes and places respectively, and to take the subscription of every such person in a schedule to be presented to them for that purpose and accordingly at the same time to collect and gather the same."

Better education of the Indians was also named among the purposes of the corporation. Twenty-five years later there were four Indian towns with schools in Massachusetts and "the praying Indians" there numbered 4,000.

This collection ordered by parliament brought about 11,000 pounds, it is reported.

Fourteen years later, in 1663, Eliot finished the first complete Bible printed in the western hemisphere. Its title page bears the lines, "At the charge and with the consent of the Corporation in England for the Promotion of the Gospel amongst the Indians in New England."

The place of printing was Cambridge, Mass., where 23 years before Eliot had helped compile the Bay Psalm book, the first book to come off the press in what is now the United States.

TROOPS ARE AGAIN SENT TO IRELAND

In Ireland which had seemed to be improving under the apparent efforts of Arthur Griffith and Michael Collins to obtain release of the kidnapped Ulster men, has become acutely dangerous as the result of the Clones affair on Saturday.

The Times' Dublin correspondent says dismay followed the news of the clash in which four special Ulster constables were killed, eight wounded and six made prisoners, and the leader of the Sinn Féiners, Matthew Fitzpatrick shot dead. The provisional government was perturbed, as the affair dashed the high hopes based upon its amnesty proclamation and the British decision to release all prisoners held for offenses committed in England from Irish political motives prior to the truce in Ireland. Developments are awaited with the utmost anxiety.

There is some conflict in the accounts of how the shooting was precipitated. Irish republican army men at Clones and their sympathizers take the stand that armed and uniformed Ulstermen had no right to enter free state territory, and subjected themselves to arrest by so doing. It is pointed out that the Gaelic football players now in the Derry jail were arrested for a similar reason by the Ulsterites.

Reply By Shooting.

The account of the shooting from the same source is that Fitzpatrick approached the Ulster constables and ordered them to raise their hands, promising no violence if they surrendered. The only reply to this demand, it is said, was the shooting and killing of Fitzpatrick, and then the republican army men fired.

In Belfast, on the other hand, it is contended the rights of southern Ireland were not infringed by sending the police from Belfast to Enniskillen by train, although the line passes for a few miles through free state territory. Northern police are declared to have traveled that route on Thursday and

BONUS APPRAISERS.

SALEM, Feb. 14.—A conference of all attorneys and appraisers in Oregon appointed under the provisions of the so-called soldiers' bonus act, will be held in Portland February 17, according to Captain Harry Brumby, secretary of the world war veterans' state aid commission. The conference will discuss bonus problems and policies relating to appraisals.

WOMEN PLAN BUREAU.

HOOVER, Wash., Feb. 14.—The Hoquiam Business Women's club plans to establish an information bureau to accommodate both strangers and citizens with a varied line of facts, including places to rent, to get board or rooms, sewing done, hand laundry work, typewriting, bookkeeping and of persons who are willing to supply in positions during vacation periods. The plan was broached at the weekly meeting of the club yesterday.

Income Tax Facts

In computing net income the tax-

payer is permitted to deduct from gross income certain deductions for losses, bad debts, contributions, interest, taxes, etc. Deductions for losses include not only losses incurred in the taxpayer's trade or business, but losses connected with any transaction "entered into for profit," or if arising from fires, storms, shipwreck, or other casualty. Deductions for losses are allowable only to the extent that they are not compensated for by insurance or otherwise.

Losses arising from the destruction or damage to property acquired prior to March 1, 1913, are to be computed on the basis of the fair market price or value as of that date, unless the cost is less than such value, in which case the loss is computed on the basis of cost.

A new provision of the revenue act

of 1921 is that in exceptional cases, and in order more clearly to reflect income, the Commissioner of Internal Revenue may permit the deduction of a loss other than in the year in which actually sustained. The taxpayer in his return, or an amended return, may deduct a loss only for the year in which sustained. If he desires to account for the loss as of another period, he must attach to his return for that year a request for consideration of the case by the commissioner, together with a complete statement of the facts. Upon audit of the return, the commissioner will decide whether the case is within the exception provided by the statute. Allowance of a deduction other than in the year in which actually sustained is entirely within the discretion of the commissioner, and will apply only in exceptional cases.
