### WALLOWA TO VOTE ON BONDS

WALLOWA, Feb. 22.—A bond election has been called for March 7 for the purpose of voting \$47,500 to build a new school building and heating plant by school district No. 12 of Wallowa county. This building will replace the recently burned high school and will be located on the present foundation. A crew of men is at work tearing down the old walls and cleaning up the debris, and many of the brick will be cleaned and used in the new building.

It is the intention to build on the unit system, the new building to be of such construction that it can be added to as needed and eventually enlarged to take care of the grades as well as high school branches. The cost of the contemplated building and heating plant is estimated at \$50,000 and will be of modern construction in every respect.
